(c) Lawful permanent residents are treated differently under
current Colorado law than United States citizens who are allowed to be
a sponsor for immigrants; and

(d) Only United States citizens and lawful permanent residents
can provide sponsorship for individuals who want to immigrate to the
United States. Lawful permanent residents do not include undocumented
immigrants who are ineligible for most federal benefits.
