# Update from Donor Alliance's CEO, Jennifer Prinz

### **About Us**

Donor Alliance is the federally designated, non-profit organ procurement organization (OPO) serving Colorado. Our community depends on us during some of the most vulnerable times in their lives. Those waiting for a transplant rely on us for a second chance at life, while the families of donors depend on us to honor their loved ones' heroic decisions to give the gift of life.



### **Record-Setting Performance**

In 2022, we facilitated more organ transplants than ever before, marking our eighth consecutive year of growth. Colorado also maintains some of the highest percentage of individuals joining the state donor registries in the country. Colorado led the country in 2022 with 66% registration rate, and always surpasses the national average of 49%. Additionally, thanks to a focus on educating communities of color and a dedication to health equity, we also have parity in transplant rates across races and ethnicities in our state. As a Malcolm Baldrige National Quality Award-winning organization, the emergency preparedness plans we established during our performance excellence journey ensured the continuity of our operations throughout the pandemic.

## **Lifesaving Impact**



Matthew Kuchera, the father of two young children from Colorado, is living proof of our commitment to continuous improvement and maximizing the gift of life. In March of 2019, he received the gift of a donated kidney and pancreas after a 26-year battle with type 1 diabetes finally led to organ failure.

After receiving the call that lifesaving organs were available, Matthew remembers his 10-year-old son crying, "I'm so happy my dad is going to live!" Now, Matthew is actively sharing his experiences to educate and inspire others on the importance of organ donation and looking forward to his son's 12th birthday. At the same time, the grieving family of his donor are finding comfort in their loved one's lasting legacy.

### **Commitment to Innovation and Progress**

We continue our commitment to excellence by implementing changes to make the system even better and we welcome a focus on continuous improvement and ongoing research in our industry. This includes new metrics presented by CMS; we're working under those now. We continue to invest in tools and technology to maximize all donation opportunities through the utilization of preservation equipment aimed at increasing the number and quality of organs for transplantation. We have experienced the benefits of continuous improvement and will always pursue innovation that maximizes the gift of life.

#### 2023 Donor Alliance Fact Sheet

Donor Alliance is the federally designated, non-profit organ procurement organization and an American Association of Tissue Banks (AATB) accredited tissue bank serving Colorado and most of Wyoming. As a recognized leader in facilitating the donation and recovery of transplantable organs and tissues, Donor Alliance's mission is to save lives through organ and tissue donation and transplantation.

To achieve this mission, Donor Alliance collaborates with 117 hospitals and 4 local transplant centers, to support donors, their families and serve our communities. Donor Alliance also inspires the public to sign up to be organ and tissue donors through community partnerships, public outreach and education campaigns throughout our donation service area.

### Fast Facts about Organ and Tissue Donation:

### Local Colorado and Wyoming stats:

- A record <u>278</u> organ donors and <u>829</u> organ transplants with <u>740</u> lives saved in 2022; that's an <u>18.8%</u> increase in organ donors and <u>29.2%</u> increase in lives saved compared to 2021.
- Donor Alliance recovered tissue for transplant from <u>1,911</u> donors which is the 3<sup>rd</sup> highest year in our service area.
- There has been a dramatic <u>56%</u> decrease in deaths on the Colorado organ transplant waitlist as compared to 2018.
- There are 1,291 people waiting for a lifesaving organ transplant in our service area.
- Of those waiting, 1,122 are waiting for a kidney—the organ most in need (86%)—and 144 are waiting for a liver (11%).
- Of those waiting for an organ transplant, 29% are under 50 years of age; another 40% are between 50 and 64.
- Colorado has the nation's highest-performing state donor registry with <u>66%</u> of driver license/ID card applicants signing up to be organ and tissue donors. Wyoming is also amongst the top five nationally at <u>61.29%</u>.
- Of the <u>278</u> organ donors, 71% were signed up on the Donate Life Colorado or Wyoming Donor Registry.
- Of the 1,911 tissue donors, 69% were signed up on the Donate Life Colorado or Wyoming Donor Registry.
- Donor Alliance's Donor Service Area serves <u>6.3</u> million residents and covers <u>184,151</u> square miles this includes all of Colorado and most of Wyoming.

#### National stats & facts:

- <u>13,529</u> people provided the lifesaving gift of organ donation upon their death last year, making 2022 the 12th consecutive record-breaking year for deceased donation in the United States, a **31.5%** increase over the last five years.
- Because of those generous <u>14,903</u> organ donors, <u>42,887</u> organ transplants were performed in the United States in 2022, setting an annual record for the 12th year.
- Additionally, 6,466 living donor transplants were performed in 2022.
- Today, 104,646 people are waiting for lifesaving organ transplants nationally.
- Of the patients waiting, 89,241(85%) are in need of a kidney and 10,723 (10%) are in need of a liver transplant.
- Transplantable organs include the heart, lungs, liver, kidneys, pancreas and small intestine.
- Recoverable tissues include bone, tendons, corneas, veins, valves and skin.
- One donor can save up to <u>8 lives</u> through organ donation and save and heal more than <u>75 lives</u> through tissue donation.
- On average, 17 people die each day while waiting for a lifesaving transplant.
- On average, about <u>109</u> transplants take place each day in the United States.
- Every 9 minutes another name is added to the national transplant waiting list.
- More than **2.5 million** tissue transplants are performed annually in the United States.
