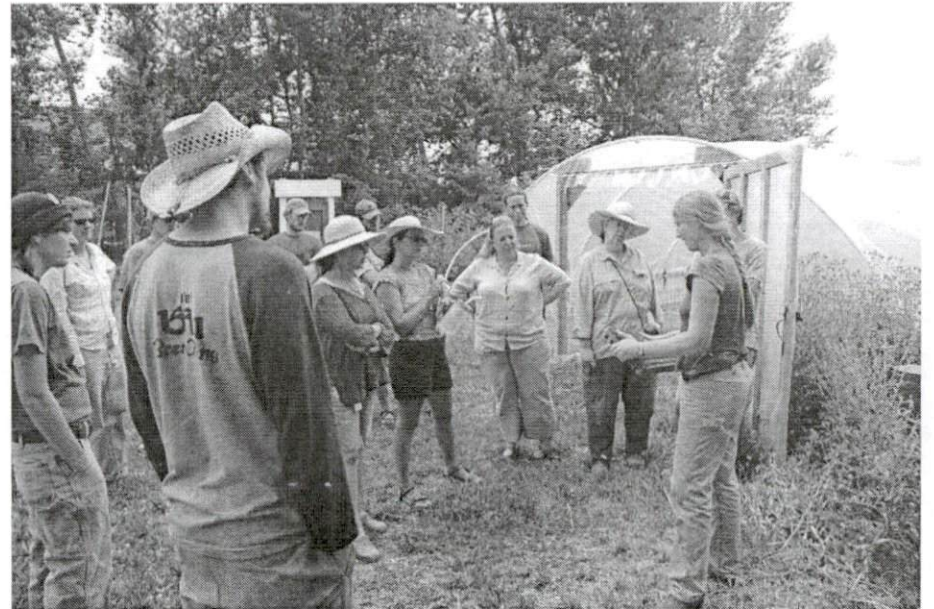

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CBF Strengths and Weaknesses

Strengths

- Low cost to participants
- Exposure to business realities
- Community/ network building
- Space and help to complete business plan
- Advanced classes for graduates
- Mentorships
- Offered in key direct market areas

Weaknesses

- Teaching production skills
- Follow up with graduates
- Mapping of area business resources
- In-depth mentorship
- Shifting from grant funded
- Statewide administration
- Limited staff time

CBF Impacts

- 400+ grads in 10 years in 12 Counties
- Mixed successes
- Catalyzed direct markets
- Community/ network building
- Fostered Colorado Land Link via Guidestone
- Increased staff knowledge

- Boomer generation moves toward retirement



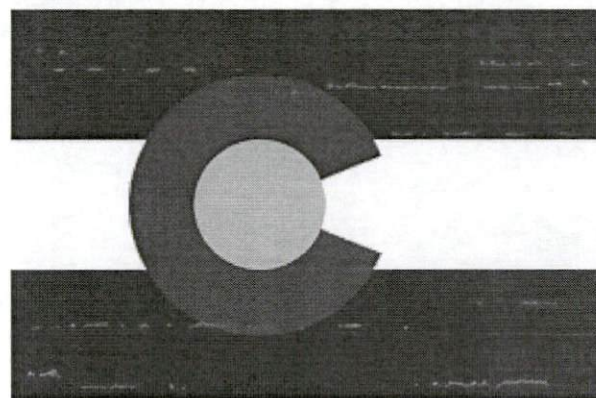
Colorado BFR Challenges
