SUBJECT LLS 17-1059 Early Childhood Education Suspension Expulsion Data

The Joint Budget Committee requested a bill draft concerning Early Childhood Education Suspension Expulsion Data (LLS 17-1059). The bill contains four components, including data gathering, development of a rubric to determine referral needs of at risk children, expanded transition from Part C to Part B of IDEA, and referrals to appropriate programs for services. The bill is currently in the drafting phase.

Based on costs estimates provided by the Department of Human Services, JBC staff requests that the Joint Budget Committee take action to placehold \$650,000 General Fund for legislation brought forth by Representative Young and JBC staff concerning LLS 17-1059 Concerning Early Childhood Education Suspension Expulsion Data. To be successful, in the first year, it will be necessary for the Department to gather baseline suspension and expulsion data; evaluate current information systems in the Department or in other Departments that may be leveraged to gather relevant data on an ongoing basis; work with subject matter experts to develop the rubric to early identify at risk children; develop a referral process; and develop processes for the expansion of early intervention case management that align with federal requirements. The FY 2017-18 costs are all one time and are outlined in the following table:
