A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING CHANGES TO THE FOOD PANTRY ASSISTANCE GRANT
 102 PROGRAM, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, MAKING AN
 103 APPROPRIATION.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at <u>http://leg.colorado.gov</u>.)

The bill expands and extends the provisions of the food pantry assistance grant program (grant program) that is currently in law. Current law states that all grants from the grant program must be made on or before December 30, 2020, and allows for grants to food banks and food pantries. The bill extends this date to February 28, 2021, and also allows

food delivery organizations to apply for a grant. The bill states that it is the intent of the general assembly that food purchased through an award from the grant program be purchased and distributed on or before June 30, 2021.

Currently, grant awards through the grant program range from \$2,500 to \$35,000. The bill no longer caps the grant awards at \$35,000. The amount a grant recipient may use for direct and indirect costs is increased from 10% to 50%.

The repeal date is extended one year, to June 30, 2023.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:* 2 **SECTION 1. Legislative declaration.** (1) The general assembly 3 finds that: 4 (a) Since March 2020, the state of Colorado has been dealing with 5 the health and economic impacts of the COVID-19 public health 6 emergency; 7 (b) The expenditures in the bill are necessary to respond to the 8 COVID-19 public health emergency; 9 (c) The expenditures in the bill were not accounted for in the 10 Colorado state budget most recently approved as of March 27, 2020, and 11 all of the expenses will be incurred on or before August 2021; and 12 (d) Any state department that receives expenditures in the bill for 13 community programs and services shall: 14 Distribute funding in a manner that utilizes existing **(I)** 15 infrastructure and contracts in the most expedited way possible; and 16 Consider the needs of underserved populations and (II) 17 communities, including African American communities, indigenous 18 communities, and other communities of people of color. 19 (2) The general assembly further finds and declares that: 20 (a) The COVID-19 public health emergency has created an

1 exponential need for emergency food resources for all emergency food 2 providers. The COVID-19 public health emergency has upended many 3 Colorado families' economic security and resulted in hunger insecurity, 4 which has increased by three times the pre-pandemic level. Since the 5 beginning of the COVID-19 public health emergency, food pantries 6 across the state have seen two to six times the number of people coming 7 in for food assistance, with many coming to a food pantry for the first 8 time.

9 (b) Funding from this legislation will help more than 150 local 10 food pantries purchase healthy, local food for more than 300,000 11 Coloradans. Funding for these grants provides critical resources for food 12 pantries to meet the increased demand, while also helping to purchase the 13 types of food their communities need from local food producers.

(c) Food banks, food pantries, and food delivery organizations
need to have additional funding to allow for the increased indirect costs
they are facing, such as increased capacity, need for refrigeration,
decreased numbers of elderly volunteers, heating for people waiting
outside, and increased delivery needs.

(3) Therefore, the general assembly determines that funding from
this legislation will help people in communities throughout Colorado
access nutritious food and support local economies as we enter the
years-long economic impact of the COVID-19 public health emergency.
SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 26-2-139, amend

24 (1)(b), (2), (3)(b), (4)(a) introductory portion, (4)(b), (4)(c), and (5); and
25 add (1)(c.5) as follows:

26 26-2-139. Food pantry assistance grant program - created 27 timeline and criteria - grants - definitions - repeal. (1) As used in this

1 section, unless the context otherwise requires:

(b) "Eligible entity" means, for the purposes of a food PANTRY
ASSISTANCE grant, either a food bank, or food pantry, OR FOOD DELIVERY
ORGANIZATION, as defined in this subsection (1). Hunger-relief charitable
organizations, as defined in section 39-22-536 (1), are not eligible entities
for purposes of this section.

7 (c.5) "FOOD DELIVERY ORGANIZATION" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL
8 CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION WITH A PRIMARY MISSION OF DELIVERING
9 FOOD TO INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE UNABLE TO SHOP FOR FOOD ON THEIR
10 OWN.

11 (2) There is created in the state department the food pantry 12 assistance grant program. The purpose of the grant program is to aid 13 Colorado food pantries, and food banks, AND FOOD DELIVERY 14 ORGANIZATIONS in the purchase of foods that better meet the needs of 15 their clientele, which has expanded significantly as a result of the 16 COVID-19 public health emergency. A secondary purpose of the grant 17 program is to create new market opportunities for Colorado agricultural 18 products and producers IT IS THE INTENT OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY 19 THAT THE FOOD PURCHASED BY THE GRANT PROGRAM IS DISTRIBUTED ON 20 OR BEFORE JUNE 30, 2021.

(3) (b) The state department is authorized to use twenty-five FIFTY
thousand dollars or up to five percent of the total funds appropriated to
the grant program for the direct and indirect costs of administering and
monitoring the grant program.

(4) (a) On or before December 30, 2020, but as soon as
practicable after the effective date of this section, the state department
shall award one or more grants OUT OF THE FEDERAL CARES ACT to

eligible entities. ON OR BEFORE FEBRUARY 28, 2021, BUT AS SOON AS
 PRACTICABLE AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION, THE STATE
 DEPARTMENT SHALL AWARD ONE OR MORE GRANTS TO ELIGIBLE ENTITIES
 USING STATE MONEY APPROPRIATED TO THE GRANT PROGRAM. In
 awarding grants, the state department shall, at a minimum, consider:

6 (b) (f) Grant awards, INCLUDING THOSE TO JOINT APPLICANTS,
7 must be at least two thousand five hundred dollars; but not more than
8 twenty thousand dollars.

9 (II) Food pantries and food banks may submit a joint application
10 for a grant award. If an application is received from two or more eligible
11 entities, the grant award must be at least two thousand five hundred
12 dollars but not more than thirty-five thousand dollars.

13 (c) (I) IT IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED THAT food purchased by a
14 grant recipient using grant money must be designated as a Colorado
15 agricultural product.

16 (II) A grant recipient may use up to ten FIFTY percent of its grant 17 award to cover the direct and indirect costs associated with the 18 implementation of its mission, including:

- 19 (A) Transportation;
- 20 (B) EXPANDING CAPACITY;
- 21 (C) EXPANDING staff costs;
- 22 (D) REFRIGERATION; and
- 23 (E) Storage.

(III) A grant recipient shall not resell or apply other associated
fees to the distribution of products purchased with money made available
through a grant.

(5) This section is repealed, effective June 30, 2022 JUNE 30,

2 SECTION 3. Appropriation. For the 2020-21 state fiscal year, 3 \$3,000,000 is appropriated to the department of human services. This 4 appropriation is from the general fund. To implement this act, the 5 department may use this appropriation for the food pantry assistance grant 6 program created in section 26-2-139, C.R.S.

SECTION 4. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
