

Overview of Universal Preschool Program Technology

Things completed since we last met:



- Uploaded providers into the UPK Colorado system
- Implemented Login.gov as our primary authentication method for LCOs and Providers
- Mapped LCOs to providers based on their catchment area
- Completed the registration flow in the system; ready for providers to begin engaging with it
- Trained LCOs on how to be administrators and support providers - this will be ongoing
- Finalized family application and matching workflow working on technical implementation now
- Engaging with trainings with providers, starting with school districts and planning on expanding to all provider types
- Collaborating with Colorado Evaluation and Action Lab and OIT to construct a longer-term data vision for UPK



Overview of Universal Preschool Program Technology

Updates:

Provider Registration

- Finalized the registration workflow, exceptions, and matching strategy.
- Began training LCOs to support their communities with registration.

Reporting

- Creating processes to maintain data on managing providers in the system.
- Building out plans for a broader data ecosystem in a data warehouse for easier reporting.



Universal Preschool Program's Data Updates



We have partnered with the Colorado Evaluation and Action Lab, OIT, and CDEC data experts to determine the best path forward to support the both near-term and long-term data vision for UPK.

We will be begin implementation of reporting structures in December.



Semi-Automated Matching for UPK Colorado

The ways applicants will be matched to providers will be semi-automated. This means that the system will be running an algorithm to help manage applications once rounds close.

There will be opportunities for providers that meet certain exceptions to be able to suggest an applicant to be rematched.

Deferred Acceptance Algorithm

Commonly used by school choice programs, the deferred acceptance algorithm assigns children to schools taking into account family choices and school/system priorities and criteria.

Highly effective in placing students in their preferred schools, as many as possible in their first choice. In Denver, 81% of incoming Kinders were placed in first choice this past year.

Registration



As providers register they will be able to specify if they meet any exceptions that include:

- Faith-based
- Language-based
- Co-Op
- Employer-based
- IEP
- District boundary

Matching Applicants to Providers



Once a provider receives the anticipated matches, they will have an opportunity to request an exception.

These exceptions will be a finite list, mirrored from the options in the registration flow.

Reporting



LCOs will be able to see, confirm, and modify provider exceptions.

We will track the data on which providers register as having an exception and how often providers are using exceptions when they receive applicants.



Provider

LCO Login



An LCO and their team will login to their accounts. Within their account, they will be able to see and edit providers.



LCOs can reach out to providers in your community and encourage them to register and participate.

Provider Registration



A provider will be able to login and begin the registration process.



Their LCO will be notified once a provider is ready to be sent the provider agreement.



Providers can log in and sign the agreement.

Publishing Providers



Once provider agreements are signed, LCOs will be able to publish providers.



Participating providers will be visible to families.
