BILL TOPIC: Firefighter Benefits

	A BILL FOR AN ACT
101	CONCERNING BENEFITS FOR FIREFIGHTERS, AND, IN CONNECTION
102	THEREWITH, ALLOWING THE INCLUSION OF PAID PART-TIME AND
103	VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS IN THE FIREFIGHTER HEART AND
104	CIRCULATORY MALFUNCTION BENEFITS PROGRAM AND
105	REQUIRING THAT RELEVANT EMPLOYERS PARTICIPATE IN
106	MULTIPLE EMPLOYER HEALTH TRUSTS THAT PROVIDE
107	FIREFIGHTER CANCER BENEFITS PROGRAMS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Wildfire Matters Review Committee. The bill makes 2 principal changes to firefighter benefits. First, the bill expands the program for firefighter heart and circulatory malfunction benefits to include paid part-time and volunteer firefighters. Second, the bill requires relevant employers to participate in multiple employer health trusts that provide firefighter cancer benefits programs.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 29-5-301 as
3	follows:
4	29-5-301. Definitions. As used in this part 3, unless the context
5	otherwise requires:
6	(1) "COVERED INDIVIDUAL" MEANS A FIREFIGHTER, PART-TIME
7	FIREFIGHTER, OR VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTER WHO MEETS THE COVERAGE
8	REQUIREMENTS IN SECTION 29-5-302 (9).
9	(1) (2) "Employer" means a municipality, special district, fire
10	authority, or county improvement district that employs one or more
11	firefighters COVERED INDIVIDUALS. Beginning July 1, 2020, "employer"
12	also means the division of fire prevention and control created in section
13	24-33.5-1201. "Employer" does not include a power authority created
14	pursuant to section 29-1-204 or a municipally owned utility.
15	(2) (3) "Firefighter" means a full-time, active employee of an
16	employer who regularly works at least one thousand six hundred hours in
17	any calendar year and whose duties are directly involved with the
18	provision of fire protection services.
19	(3) (4) "Heart and circulatory malfunction" means a sudden and
20	serious malfunction of the heart and circulatory system as occurs in a
21	diagnosis of coronary thrombosis, cerebral vascular accident, myocardial
22	infarction, or cardiac arrest and that meets the requirements of section

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1 29-5-302 (6). "Heart and circulatory malfunction" does not include 2 hypertension or angina. 3 (5) "PART-TIME FIREFIGHTER" MEANS AN ACTIVE EMPLOYEE OF AN 4 EMPLOYER WHO REGULARLY WORKS LESS THAN ONE THOUSAND SIX 5 HUNDRED HOURS IN ANY CALENDAR YEAR, WHOSE DUTIES ARE DIRECTLY 6 INVOLVED WITH THE PROVISION OF FIRE PROTECTION SERVICES, AND WHO 7 IS NOT A VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTER. 8 "Volunteer firefighter" means EITHER a volunteer $\frac{(4)}{(6)}$ 9 firefighter as defined in section 31-30-1102, C.R.S. OR A PERSON WHO 10 PROVIDES VOLUNTEER SERVICES TO A FIRE AUTHORITY THAT IS CREATED 11 BY AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT THAT PROVIDES FIRE 12 PROTECTION. 13 (5) (7) "Work event" means stressful or strenuous activity related 14 to fire suppression, rescue, hazardous material response, emergency 15 medical services, disaster relief, or other emergency response activity. 16 "Work event" includes a training activity that a firefighter COVERED 17 INDIVIDUAL engages in while on duty and that involves stressful or 18 strenuous activity. 19 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 29-5-302, amend (1), 20 (2)(a), (2)(b), (2)(d), (2)(e), (3), (4), (5), (8), (9) introductory portion, 21 (9)(a), (9)(b), and (11)(a) as follows: 22 29-5-302. Required benefits - conditions of receiving benefits. 23 (1) An employer shall maintain accident insurance, self-insure, or 24 participate in a self-insurance pool or a multiple employer health trust in 25 order to provide the benefits specified in this section for its firefighters. 26 In addition, an employer may provide equivalent benefits for volunteer

firefighters. COVERED INDIVIDUALS, UNLESS THE FUNDING PROVIDED FOR

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1	THE BENEFIT REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION IS INSUFFICIENT PURSUANT TO
2	SUBSECTION (12) OF THIS SECTION.
3	(2) An employer shall provide the following minimum benefits:
4	(a) (I) A four-thousand-dollar-lump-sum payment if a medical
5	examination reveals that a firefighter COVERED INDIVIDUAL has a heart
6	and circulatory malfunction; and
7	(II) A one-thousand-five-hundred-dollar payment per week, up to
8	a maximum of seven weeks, if a firefighter COVERED INDIVIDUAL made
9	an emergency room visit and was hospitalized for up to forty-eight hours
10	for a heart and circulatory malfunction;
11	(b) (I) A two-thousand-dollar payment per week, up to a
12	maximum of twenty-five weeks, if a firefighter COVERED INDIVIDUAL
13	made an emergency room visit and was hospitalized for more than
14	forty-eight hours for a heart and circulatory malfunction; or
15	(II) A two-thousand-five-hundred-dollar payment PER WEEK, up
16	to a maximum of eighty weeks, if a firefighter COVERED INDIVIDUAL has
17	a heart and circulatory malfunction that prohibits the firefighter COVERED
18	INDIVIDUAL from returning to employment to a position that the
19	firefighter COVERED INDIVIDUAL is trained for or reasonably could be
20	trained to perform;
21	(d) A ten-thousand-dollar payment if a firefighter COVERED
22	INDIVIDUAL incurs cosmetic disfigurement resulting from a heart and
23	circulatory malfunction; and
24	(e) If the covered heart and circulatory malfunction is diagnosed
25	as terminal, the firefighter will receive a lump sum payment of
26	twenty-five thousand dollars as an accelerated payment toward the
27	benefits due in paragraphs (a) and (b) of this subsection (2) SUBSECTIONS

(2)(a) AND (2)(b) OF THIS SECTION.

- (3) The receipt of a payment pursuant to subparagraph (II) of paragraph (a) or subparagraph (I) of paragraph (b) of subsection (2) of this section SUBSECTION (2)(a)(II) OR (2)(b)(I) OF THIS SECTION does not prohibit the firefighter COVERED INDIVIDUAL from receiving an additional benefit.
- (4) If a firefighter COVERED INDIVIDUAL returns to the same position of employment after a heart and circulatory malfunction, the firefighter COVERED INDIVIDUAL is entitled to the benefits in subsection (2) of this section for any subsequent heart and circulatory malfunction.
- (5) The maximum amount that may be paid to a firefighter COVERED INDIVIDUAL for each heart and circulatory malfunction is two hundred fifty thousand dollars.
- (8) The benefits in this section are reduced by twenty-five percent if a firefighter COVERED INDIVIDUAL smoked a tobacco product within five years immediately preceding the work event.
- (9) In order for a firefighter COVERED INDIVIDUAL to be eligible for the benefits in subsection (2) of this section, the following conditions must be met:
- (a) Prior to the work event that results in a heart and circulatory malfunction and after the firefighter COVERED INDIVIDUAL became employed by an employer, the firefighter COVERED INDIVIDUAL had a medical examination that would reasonably have found an illness or injury that could have caused the heart and circulatory malfunction and no illness or injury was found at the most recent SUCH medical examination;
- (b) The A COVERED INDIVIDUAL WHO IS A firefighter has MUST

1	HAVE at least five years of continuous, full-time employment with an
2	employer; except A COVERED INDIVIDUAL WHO IS A PART-TIME
3	FIREFIGHTER MUST HAVE AT LEAST FIVE YEARS OF CONTINUOUS,
4	PART-TIME OR FULL-TIME EMPLOYMENT WITH AN EMPLOYER; AND A
5	COVERED INDIVIDUAL WHO IS a volunteer firefighter must have AT LEAST
6	five years of continuous service with the same employer; and
7	(11) (a) There is hereby created in the state treasury the firefighter
8	benefits cash fund. The fund consists of moneys MONEY appropriated
9	from the general fund by the general assembly. The moneys MONEY in the
10	fund are IS subject to annual appropriation by the general assembly to the
11	department of local affairs for the purpose of reimbursing employers for
12	the direct costs of maintaining accident insurance, self-insurance, or
13	participation in a self-insurance pool or multiple employer health trust as
14	required by this part 3.
15	SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 29-5-403, amend (1)
16	and (2); and add (14) as follows:
17	29-5-403. Required benefits - conditions of receiving benefits.
18	(1) An employer may SHALL participate in the voluntary firefighter
19	cancer benefits program by paying contributions into AND MAKE
20	CONTRIBUTIONS TO a multiple employer health trust as set forth in section
21	10-3-903.5 (7)(b)(I), established for the purposes of this part 4. The
22	contribution levels, IF ANY, and award level definitions will be set by the
23	trust. If at any time the funding provided pursuant to subsection
24	(14) OF THIS SECTION IS INSUFFICIENT TO COVER THE COST OF THE
25	PROGRAM REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION, THEN PARTICIPATION IN THE
26	PROGRAM IS OPTIONAL PURSUANT TO SECTION 29-1-304.5.
27	(2) For an employer choosing to participate in the voluntary A

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1	MULTIPLE EMPLOYER HEALTH TRUST THAT IS ESTABLISHED TO PROVIDE A
2	firefighter cancer benefits program the trust shall provide the minimum
3	benefits specified in subsection (3) of this section to covered individuals
4	diagnosed with cancer, based on the award level of the cancer at the time
5	of diagnosis, after the employer becomes a participant.
6	(14) IF AT ANY TIME THE FUNDING PROVIDED PURSUANT TO THIS
7	SUBSECTION (14) IS INSUFFICIENT TO COVER THE COST OF THE PROGRAM
8	REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION, THEN PARTICIPATION IN THE PROGRAM IS
9	OPTIONAL PURSUANT TO SECTION 29-1-304.5.
10	SECTION 4. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 29-5-405 as
11	follows:
12	29-5-405. Exclusion from coverage. REGARDLESS OF THE
13	FUNDING PROVIDED PURSUANT TO SECTION 29-5-403 (14), an employer
13 14	FUNDING PROVIDED PURSUANT TO SECTION 29-5-403 (14), an employer who participates in the voluntary firefighter cancer benefits program
