BILL TOPIC: "Teacher Training To Address Literacy Challenges"

A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING TRAINING FOR TEACHERS TO ADDRESS ISSUES FACED BY
102 YOUNG CHILDREN WITH LITERACY CHALLENGES.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Early Childhood and School Readiness Legislative Commission. Under existing law, the department of education (department) may make technical assistance and training to address issues faced by students with literacy challenges, including dyslexia, available to school districts, administrative units, and other agencies that provide education. The bill requires the department to provide this technical

assistance and training to education agencies that serve children in preschool and kindergarten. The bill directs the state board of education to include in the teacher licensure standards the requirement that each candidate for an initial teacher license to teach preschool or kindergarten demonstrate the ability to address students' needs in the areas of literacy assessment and instructional skills, including dyslexia awareness, identification, and remediation for general and special education. The bill requires that traditional and alternative teacher preparation programs for candidates training to teach in preschool or kindergarten include instruction in the areas of literacy assessment and instructional skills, including dyslexia awareness, identification, and remediation for general and special education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-2-133, **amend** (1),

22-2-133. Assessment and identification of students with literacy challenges including dyslexia - training and technical assistance - collaboration with higher education - report - definitions. (1) On or before August 1, 2008 2019, as part of its responsibility for education standards and practice, the department may SHALL make available to each school district, administrative unit as defined IN SECTION 22-20-103 (1), OR OTHER LOCAL EDUCATION AGENCY, WHICH SERVES STUDENTS ENROLLED IN PRESCHOOL AND KINDERGARTEN, technical assistance and training concerning issues faced by PRESCHOOL AND KINDERGARTEN students with literacy challenges, including dyslexia. to school districts, administrative units as defined in section 22-20-103 (1), residential treatment facilities, correctional facilities, and other local education agencies throughout the state THE DEPARTMENT MAY ALSO MAKE AVAILABLE TO SCHOOL DISTRICTS, ADMINISTRATIVE UNITS, RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT FACILITIES, CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES, AND OTHER LOCAL EDUCATION AGENCIES THROUGHOUT THE STATE TECHNICAL

ASSISTANCE AND TRAINING CONCERNING THESE ISSUES AS FACED BY STUDENTS ENROLLED IN FIRST THROUGH TWELFTH GRADE. The provision of any technical assistance and training pursuant to this subsection (1) shall not preclude the department from using federal funds to implement such technical assistance and training. Any Technical assistance and training provided shall MUST include, but need not be limited to, the areas of awareness, assessment, identification, and evidence-based progress monitoring, and shall MUST include scientifically based interventions to address the needs of students with literacy challenges, including dyslexia. Any Technical assistance and training provided shall represent MUST INCLUDE a tiered continuum of intensity for intervention consistent with the response to intervention model that school districts are required to implement no later than August 15, 2009, pursuant to rules adopted by the department STATE BOARD.

(2) The department is encouraged to SHALL coordinate any THE technical assistance and training provided PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION with current best practices and work occurring in teacher preparation programs at institutions of higher education. Where appropriate, the department is encouraged to SHALL provide technical assistance and training to school districts, administrative units, residential treatment facilities, correctional facilities, and local education agencies in a coordinated effort with teacher preparation programs at institutions of higher education. The department and institutions of higher education are encouraged to SHALL work collaboratively to develop or affirm minimum standards for teacher preparation programs in the areas of literacy assessment and instructional skills, including dyslexia awareness, identification, and remediation for general and special education.

- **23-1-121.** Commission directive approval of educator preparation programs review. (2) The commission shall adopt policies establishing the requirements for educator preparation programs offered by institutions of higher education. The department shall work in cooperation with the state board of education in developing the requirements for educator preparation programs. At a minimum, the requirements must ensure that each educator preparation program complies with section 23-1-125, is designed on a performance-based model, and includes:
- (c.5) FOR CANDIDATES TRAINING TO TEACH STUDENTS IN PRESCHOOL AND KINDERGARTEN, INSTRUCTION IN THE AREAS OF LITERACY ASSESSMENT AND INSTRUCTIONAL SKILLS, INCLUDING DYSLEXIA
