BILL TOPIC: "Funding Sch Access For Emer Response Grant Prog"

A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING FUNDING FOR THE SCHOOL ACCESS FOR EMERGENCY**
102 **RESPONSE GRANT PROGRAM CASH FUND.**

Bill Summary

School Safety Committee. Under existing law, the state treasurer is required to annually transfer \$5 million from the state public school fund to the school access for emergency response grant program cash fund. The bill increases the amount of the annual transfer to \$10 million beginning on July 1, 2020.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-33.5-2107,
3 **amend** (1)(b) as follows:

4 **24-33.5-2107. School access for emergency response grant**
5 **program cash fund - repeal.** (1) (b) (I) (A) On July 1, 2018, and each
6 July 1 thereafter through ~~July 1, 2023~~ JULY 1, 2019, the state treasurer
7 shall transfer five million dollars to the fund from the state public school
8 fund created in section 22-54-114.

9 (B) THIS SUBSECTION (1)(b)(I) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JUNE 30,
10 2021.

11 (II) ON JULY 1, 2020, AND EACH JULY 1 THEREAFTER THROUGH
12 JULY 1, 2023, THE STATE TREASURER SHALL TRANSFER TEN MILLION
13 DOLLARS TO THE FUND FROM THE STATE PUBLIC SCHOOL FUND CREATED
14 IN SECTION 22-54-114.

15 **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
16 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
17 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
