A BILL FOR AN ACT

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at <u>http://leg.colorado.gov/</u>.) **Wildfire Matters Review Committee.** The bill strongly encourages a locally defined or interjurisdictional emergency management plan amended or created on or after July 1, 2024, to address the needs of an individual with an animal during an emergency by:

- Including provisions for the evacuation, shelter, and transport of an individual with an animal and that animal; and
- Requiring, to the extent practicable, that at least one shelter established during an emergency is designated to accommodate an individual with an animal and that animal.

The bill also strongly encourages a city, county, or city and county to make available to the public information for animal emergency preparedness, including:

- Information for creating an evacuation plan and emergency checklist for individuals with animals consistent with recommendations publicly published by the United States department of agriculture and the federal emergency management agency;
- Local organizations that may provide emergency animal assistance; and
- Local emergency shelters, cooling centers, or warming centers, when active, that can accommodate an individual with an animal.

6 INFORMATION FOR ANIMAL EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS, INCLUDING:

12 (II) LOCAL ORGANIZATIONS THAT MAY PROVIDE EMERGENCY13 ANIMAL ASSISTANCE; AND

14 (III) LOCAL EMERGENCY SHELTERS, COOLING CENTERS, OR
15 WARMING CENTERS, WHEN ACTIVE, THAT CAN ACCOMMODATE AN
16 INDIVIDUAL WITH AN ANIMAL.

17 (c) As used in this subsection (8.5), unless the context
18 Otherwise requires, "Animal" means both a "pet animal", as
19 Defined in Section 38-20-101 (3.5), and a "service animal", as
20 Defined in Section 12-240-144 (4)(c).

SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state institutions.

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
