




We're putting students at the center of everything we do


- Affordability is a priority

AFFORDABILITY IS A PRIORITY



ACCESS WITH INTEGRITY: STUDENT SUCCESS

- Social, academic, and cultural support from centers, advising, and TRIO programs
- Access to high-level undergraduate research and a significant grants portfolio
- Increased educational pathways to FLC through relationships with
 K-12 and community college partners



RESHAPING THE STUDENT EXPERIENCE

AT THE PROSPECTIVE STUDENT LEVEL (APPLICATION)

- Reducing barriers to application completion and enrollment
 - Accepting unofficial scores
 - De-hassling entry/Supplemental academic instruction
- Reducing financial burdens
 - Waived application fee for approximately 80% of students
 - Encouraging concurrent enrollment
 - Scholarships





RESHAPING THE STUDENT EXPERIENCE

AT THE CURRENT STUDENT LEVEL (RETENTION)

- Easing the business of being a student with Skyhawk Station
- Reducing notification overload with centralized communications
- Increasing mentor relationships with First-Year Launch
- Increasing family connections by subsidizing Family Orientation
- Internships and student employment



RESHAPING THE STUDENT EXPERIENCE

AT THE CURRENT STUDENT LEVEL (RETENTION)

- Addressing financial concerns
 - Addressing food insecurity (Grub Hub food pantry and hot meals)
 - Offering persistence grants to help with unexpected barriers
- Addressing mental health concerns
 - Including free counseling sessions for every student no student ever turned away regardless of ability to pay



FISCAL CHALLENGES FOR FLC

- COST CHALLENGES
 - Dichotomy of rural + resort communities
 - Cost of living and transportation
 - Student challenges
 - Faculty and staff challenges
- SIZE OF INSTITUTION
 - Lack economies of scale
 - Small departments have hiring challenges
 - Availability and retention of faculty/staff



COST CONTAINMENT STRATEGIES

- HELPING STUDENTS GET TO WHERE THEY WANT TO GO
 - CU-Denver 3-2 Master's Degree in Public History
 - DU 3-2 Master's Degree of Social Work
 - PCC to FLC transfer pathways
 - Supporting students ability to finish in four years
- SYSTEM-LEVEL
 - City of Durango recreation projects
 - Exploring purchasing arrangements/shared back office function
 - IT Capital Request with Adams, Western, FLC
 - Annual and on-going budget reduction and reallocation



SOLUTIONS & IDEAS

- WHAT WE CAN DO
 - Improve bundling of financial aid
 - Cost containment
 - Expand on-campus housing opportunities
 - Continue to drive economic development
