SUBJECT: Making Higher Education Attainable Interim Committee Charge

Summary

This memorandum describes the Making Higher Education Attainable Interim Committee's (committee) membership, charge, bill limits, and bill deadlines.

Committee Membership

The committee is a six-member legislative committee that is authorized to meet over the 2019 legislative interim. Committee members are appointed by members of legislative leadership as follows:

- two Senators appointed by the President of the Senate, one of who is appointed chair;
- one Senator appointed by the Senate Minority Leader;
- two Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, one of whom is appointed vice-chair; and
- one Representative appointed by the House Minority Leader.

Membership is outlined in the table below.

Committee Charge

The committee may meet five times during the 2019 legislative interim to study the following policy issues:

- the high costs of higher education;
- college tuition rate setting;
- roadblocks to obtaining postsecondary education; and
- risks and rewards of postsecondary education.

The committee is also authorized to travel outside of the Denver metropolitan area to better address the issues it studies.

Committee Recommendations to the Legislative Council

Bill limits. The committee may recommend three bills to the Legislative Council. Bills approved by the Legislative Council do not count against a member's five-bill limit for the regular legislative session. Bills not approved by the Legislative Council may be introduced in the regular session, but such bills will count against a member's five-bill limit. Interim committee bills must have prime sponsors prior to consideration by the Legislative Council.

Requirements for bill drafts. The Executive Committee of the Legislative Council's guidelines for interim committees require that at least a majority of the committee membership approve a bill in concept prior to requesting a bill draft. Requests for draft bills must occur during a single committee meeting set for requesting legislation, no later than *September 23, 2019*. Committee members must make drafting information available at the meeting at which the members request bills or must submit such information to the bill drafter within three calendar days after the meeting. Failure to submit the drafting information prior to the three-day deadline will be deemed as a withdrawal of the bill request. The final meeting to consider and take final action on bill drafts must occur no later than *November 4, 2019*.
