



Update on Capitol Complex Repair & Restoration August 11, 2020

- DPA dedicated to returning Capitol Complex buildings back to pristine condition
- Challenged by ongoing vandalism
- Special care needed for paint removal
- Pairing repair work with scheduled restoration project





May

- Capitol Complex team immediately began cleanup efforts following May 28 damage
- As damage continued, DPA took steps to protect employees/buildings & wait for damage to subside
- Continuous strategic planning to properly restore damage





- 6/1: DPA files insurance claim with State Risk Management
- 6/1: OSA grants Emergency Project designation to expedite work
- 6/1: GH Phipps expands scope of work to assist with project
- 6/1-6/2: Additional attempts to clean graffiti called off due to threats of violence
- 6/7: State partners with City of Denver to remove graffiti off Capitol Complex buildings besides Capitol, due to extra care needed
- 6/15-6/16: OSA provides \$490,000 in funding to begin repairs



- 6/25: After Union Soldier statue toppled, DPA removed statue & cannons to prevent further damage
- 6/25: DPA, CDPS, and U.S. Dept. of Homeland Security conducted security assessment
- 6/26: Approval of initial insurance funding of \$525,000 to initiate repairs





- 7/2-7/17: GH Phipps installs fencing and screen around Capitol to begin restoration work & cleanup
- 7/17: Graffiti removal begins
 - Many areas to require multiple treatments
 - GH Phipps brings second crew to expedite removal





July

- Week of 7/20:
 - Graffiti removal continues & plywood removed from unbroken first floor windows
 - Additional windows broken on Centennial Bldg & LSB
- Week of 7/27:
 - Lincoln Park cleared & fenced off
 - Environmental cleaning company contracted to start cleanup of park







- Week of 8/3:
 - Graffiti removal continues
 - Glass replacement begins on Capitol
 - Plywood removed as glass replaced
 - Plywood remains on ground level for security
 - Veterans Monument in Lincoln Park assessed for damage by preservation committee & construction company

Capitol Complex Repair & Restoration Next Steps

- Week of 8/10:
 - Landscape company to begin repairs to Lincoln Park
 - Capitol Complex to begin repairs and replacement of pole lighting
- August-September:
 - Graffiti removal to continue until completed
 - Glass replacement around complex scheduled to be completed by end of September with focus on Capitol first
 - Trees replaced around Veterans Monument



Capitol Complex Repair & Restoration Total Costs & Funding

- \$1.1 million estimate of repairs
- Fund sources:
 - \$5k deductible to be paid by DPA Capitol Complex
 - Short-term: OSA emergency funds front the money for repairs
 - Long-term: State's Risk Management Program will pay for the first \$1m out of the Property Fund (reimburse OSA)
 - Costs substantially over \$1m may be subject to reimbursement through stop-loss coverage
