### POST-RELEASE RECIDIVISM


 New misdemeanor or felony filing within one year of successful termination from probation.



### **PRE-RELEASE RECIDIVISM**


 New deferred agreement, adjudication, or conviction while under probation supervision


### **POST-RELEASE RECIDIVISM**


 New deferred agreement, adjudication, or conviction 1, 2, and 3 years post-release from probation regardless of whether that release is considered successful.
