Committee Charge

Pursuant to state law, the TLRC must meet at least once a year to:

- provide guidance and direction to CDOT on the development of the state transportation system;
- provide legislative oversight of and input into such state transportation system development;
- provide guidance and direction to the Department of Revenue (DOR) or any other state agency or political subdivision of the state that regulates motor vehicles or traffic;
- examine the problem of uninsured motorists; and review all transportation, traffic, and motor vehicle legislation, and make recommendations for additional legislation as necessary.

During the 2024 legislative interim only, the TLRC must study the issues of:

- enforcement of impaired driving offenses, including situations involving a driver who refuses to take or complete a blood or breath test as required by law;
- · careless driving that results in accidental death; and
- the appropriate penalty for failing to maintain motor vehicle or low-powered scooter insurance and present evidence of insurance to a requesting officer.

Recommended Legislation

As a result of committee discussion and deliberation, the committee recommends the following bills for consideration in the 2025 legislative session.

Bill A – Increase Transport Mode Choice Reduce Emissions

The bill requires the Department of Transportation, metropolitan planning organizations, local governments, and subject transit providers to implement plans to increase transportation mode choice.

Bill B – Motor Vehicle Regulation Administration

The bill makes various changes to policy on motor vehicle registration and state identification credentials, and establishes vehicular document piracy as a new civil infraction.

Bill C – Local Funding for Vulnerable Road User Protection

The bill authorizes local governments to impose vehicle registration fees to fund vulnerable road user protection strategies.

Bill D – Railroad Investigative Report Confidentiality

The bill repeals the confidentiality requirement for investigative reports of railroads, with exceptions for certain ongoing investigations and security information.

Bill E - Paratransit Services

The bill imposes new duties on any entities providing paratransit services in the state and creates the Paratransit Task Force
