### Summary of Measure

This initiative endeavors to require the investigation of child deaths.

### Assessment of No Fiscal Impact

The measure references several bills concerning the investigation of child deaths. However, because the measure does not include substantive changes to the current statutes concerning these topics, the fiscal impact cannot be assessed. As such, the measure is assessed as having no fiscal impact on state or local revenue and expenditures.

### Effective Date

If approved by voters at the 2020 general election, this measure takes effect upon proclamation of the Governor, no later than 30 days after the official canvass of the vote is completed.
