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Department Structure. The Department of Military and Veterans Affairs is comprised of four divisions, which will be considered in order:

- (1) Executive Director and Army National Guard
- (2) Division of Veterans Affairs
- (3) Air National Guard
- (4) Federal Funded Programs

SMART Act recommendations of House and Senate Oversight Committees. The SMART Act allows a Committee of Reference to make formal recommendations to the Joint Budget Committee regarding the budget requests of the state agencies that they oversee. The Senate and House State, Veterans, and Military Affairs Committees did not make any recommendations regarding the budget request of the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs, over which these committees have oversight. The letters from this Committee are reproduced in Appendix 1 of this document.

(1) EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND ARMY NATIONAL GUARD

The Executive Director's Office is responsible for the overall administration of the Department. It provides leadership to the Department by managing the general administrative functions, which include Leadership and Policy Development; Human Resource Management; Accounting; Purchasing and contracting; Budgeting; and Information Technology. The Executive Director's office is also responsible for the legislative program of the Department at both the state and federal level.

The Army National Guard and the Air National Guard are separate entities, funded by the federal government and managed and staffed by Federal Civil Service employees. The federal government fully funds National Guard training and provides most of the funding for construction of armories and other military facilities. Under its cooperative agreements with the federal government, the Department provides 50 percent of maintenance and utilities costs at seventeen state owned armories, and 20 or 25 percent of these costs at four federal facilities.

<u>**Personal Services**</u>. The following table presents the staffing summary for the Executive Director and Army National Guard Division.

No federal funds appropriations for IT line items. Due to security requirements, the Department has a distinct state Information Technology (IT) system. Costs associated with joint use systems (e.g. land line phones) that are funded by the Federal government are accounted for by utilizing in-kind assistance. This process allows the cooperative agreement money that would go from Federal to State control for this purpose to remain within the Federal contracting system, preventing the co-mingling of funds. As a consequence there are no federal funds in the Department's IT appropriations.

Information Technology Asset Maintenance. This line item provides funding for the upkeep and maintenance of the Department's information technology infrastructure. **Staff recommends approving the Department's request for a continuation appropriation of \$22,372 General Fund.**

Legal Services for 110 Hours. This line item funds the purchase of legal services from the Department of Law. The Department requests a continuation appropriation of 110 hours of legal services for lawsuits, workers' compensation cases, and contract review, to be paid from the General Fund. The dollar value of the request, based on the FY 2011-12 legal services rate is \$8,328.

Staff recommends a continuation appropriation of 110 hours of legal services. Staff recommendation for the corresponding dollar appropriation awaits Committee approval of the FY 2012-13 legal services rate, which will be established during figure setting for the Department of Law. Staff requests permission to multiply the approved rate by the number of approved hours and include the resulting appropriation in the Long Bill.

<u>Purchase of Services from Computer Center</u>. This line item provides funding for the Department's use of the centralized computer system maintained by the Office of Information Technology (OIT). Based on rates charged by OIT, the Department requests an increase of \$173,571 General Fund for this appropriation. The Staff recommendation is pending Committee approval of a common policy for this line item.

Payment to Risk Management and Property Funds. This line item funds the Department's share of the costs of the State's self-insurance program for property losses and other risks. The Department requests an appropriation of \$147,740 General Fund, an increase of \$37,410 from the FY 2011-12 Long Bill appropriation.

Staff's recommendation is pending Committee common policy. Staff will reflect Committee common policy in the appropriation for this line item.

<u>Vehicle Lease Payments</u>. This line item funds lease costs of the Department's vehicle fleet. The Department requests an appropriation of \$47,549 General Fund, an increase of \$3,401 over it's FY

2011-12 appropriation. The Department requests replacement during FY 2012-13 of a 2004 model year, five passenger, 4 x 4, utility vehicle that will have a projected odometer reading of 169,081 miles by May 2013. Total acquisition cost for the new vehicle will equal \$31,694; it will be acquired through a 96 month (8 year) lease. Staff recommends replacement of this vehicle.

Staff's recommendation of a General Fund dollar appropriation is pending Committee common policy for lease rates.

Leased Space. This line item funds the lease for the offices of the Division of Veterans Affairs located at 7465 E. First Avenue in Denver. The Department requests a continuation appropriation of \$44,978 General Fund.

Staff recommends that the Committee approve the Department's request for a continuation appropriation of \$44,978 General Fund.

<u>Capitol Complex Leased Space</u>. This line item provides funding for the buildings occupied by the Colorado National Guard occupied at Camp George West. The federal government only pays its share of the Camp George West utilities costs; it does not pay any of the other Capital-complex-leased-space costs. The Department requests an appropriation of \$91,110, comprised of \$57,565 General Fund and \$33,545 federal funds. This request reflects a statewide common policy adjustment that increases the total requested appropriation by \$7,651, including an increase of \$4,832 General Fund and an increase of \$2,819 federal funds.

Staff's recommendation is pending Committee approval of a common policy for this line item.

<u>Communications Services Payments</u>. This line item funds the Department's costs for network and telephone communications services and the digital trunked radio network. The Department requests \$29,265 General Fund, which reflects a statewide common policy adjustment of \$16,164 General Fund.

Staff's recommendation is pending Committee approval of a common policy for this line item.

<u>**Civil Air Patrol Operations</u></u>. The Civil Air Patrol is a federally-chartered nonprofit corporation that serves as a civilian auxiliary of the U.S. Air Force. It has three key missions: emergency services (which includes search and rescue, and disaster relief operations), aerospace education, and cadet programs for teenage youth. The Colorado Wing of the Patrol consists of approximately 2,000 volunteers and has 15 aircraft located around the state. The Colorado Wing receives its primary support from the Federal Government; the Department supports the Wing by providing 1.0 FTE and by paying part of the minor aircraft maintenance and operating expenses. The bulk of the funding for operations and maintenance comes from the Civil Air Patrol's national organization.</u>**

During the 2010 session, the General Assembly consolidated the Civil Air Patrol Division with the Executive Director and Army National Guard Division. This line item combined two line items, Operating Expenses and Aircraft Maintenance, that were formerly presented in the Civil Air Patrol Division.

Staff recommends that the Committee approve the Department's request for a continuing appropriation of \$58,638 General Fund.

Local Armory Incentive Program. This line item provides spending authority for revenues collected for armory rentals. This spending authority pays for rental-related costs.

Staff recommends that the Committee approve the Department's request for a continuing appropriation of \$46,610 cash funds from armory rental proceeds.

(House Bill 11-1237 created the Chargeable Quarters and Billeting Cash Fund, which receives moneys charged for the use of National Guard facilities. The bill allows the fund to be used for the costs associated with the operation, repair and maintenance of those facilities. Moneys in the fund are continuously appropriated to the Department.)

Distance Learning. This line item provides spending authority for revenues received from the use of the Department's distance learning facilities. The Department requests an appropriation of \$3,000 cash funds from fees on distance learning facilities and equipment.

Staff recommends approving the Department's request for a continuing appropriation of \$3,000 cash funds.

<u>Colorado National Guard Tuition Fund</u>. This line item provides funding for tuition assistance for members of the Colorado National Guard who attend Colorado state universities and colleges. The Department requests a continuation appropriation of \$1,046,157, comprised of \$246,157 General Fund and \$800,000 reappropriated funds from the Colorado Commission on Higher Education. The reappropriated funds are originally appropriated to the Department of Higher Education and are then reappropriated to the Department.

Staff recommends approving the Department's request for a continuing appropriation of \$1,046,157, including \$246,157 General Fund and \$800,000 reappropriated funds.

<u>Army National Guard Cooperative Agreement</u>. This line item funds programs that are 100 percent federally funded under the Department's cooperative agreements with the U.S. National Guard Bureau for the operations and maintenance of the Colorado Army National Guard program. The line includes both personal services and operating expenses. The Department requests an appropriation of \$3,491,693 federal funds and 51.5 FTE, of which it projects 71 percent will be used for personal services and 29 percent for operating expenses. The request is adjusted for the end of the PERA Contribution shift, an increase of \$54,991.

As the following table shows, the staff recommendation is pending a Committee decision on the base personal services adjustment.

(2) DIVISION OF VETERANS AFFAIRS

The Division of Veterans Affairs represents veterans in federal benefits claims, provides information and training to county veterans service officers, and operates and maintains the Western Slope Military Veterans Cemetery in Grand Junction. The State Board of Veterans Affairs advises the Division on matters pertaining to veterans, makes grants from the Colorado State Veterans Trust

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Fund for capital improvements and amenities at state veterans nursing homes; costs of state veterans cemeteries; costs of the Division, and for veterans programs operated by non-profit veterans organizations. The Trust Fund receives one percent of the revenue from the Tobacco Master Settlement Agreement, up to \$1 million.

<u>Veterans Service Operations</u>. This line item funds salaries and PERA contributions for 8.0 FTE who assist veterans in obtaining benefits from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. These employees also assist county veterans service officers with their duties and provide training for those officers. This line item also provides funding for the program's operating and administrative expenses. The following table summarizes staffing.

The cash funds come from the Colorado State Veterans Trust Fund.

<u>County Veterans Service Officer Payments</u>. This line item funds payments to counties for administrative support of county veterans service officers. The Department requests a continuation appropriation of \$190,564 General Fund.

Section 28-5-801 (1), C.R.S. requires each county to appoint a County Veterans Service Officer (CVSO). Some counties have one or more full-time CVSO, others have a part-time or volunteer CVSO, while at least two counties share a CVSO with another county. The state reimburses the counties at the rate of \$200 per month for a part-time officer and \$400 per month for a full-time

officer. The appropriation for this program is \$88,800, while counties report that they spent more than \$1.2 million in support of the program.

This line item also funds a pilot program in five counties that reimburses counties for increasing their efforts to enroll veterans with the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs. Enrolling additional veterans has the potential to bring additional federal dollars to the state in the form of veterans pensions, health care, vocational rehabilitation and employment, education and training, home loans, life insurance, and other benefits. The original appropriation for this pilot program was \$124,354 General Fund, however, due to the General Fund revenue shortfall, that appropriation was reduced to \$79,264 in FY 2008-09. The appropriation has been set at \$101,854 since FY 2009-10. The FY 2012-13 budget request is for a continuation of the appropriation.

Staff recommends a continuation appropriation of \$190,654 General Fund.

<u>Colorado State Veterans Trust Fund Expenditures</u>. The Colorado State Veterans Trust fund is funded by a transfer of one percent of the revenue that the State receives from the Tobacco Master Settlement Agreement (MSA), up to a maximum of \$1 million. Pursuant to Section 28-5-709 (3) (c), C.R.S., 90 percent of the moneys transferred, plus accumulated interest earned by the Trust, are subject to appropriation by the General Assembly to the Department. These funds can be used for capital improvements and amenities at state veterans nursing homes; costs of state veterans cemeteries; costs of the Division, and for veterans programs operated by non-profit veterans organizations. The Department requests an appropriation of \$1,029,275 cash funds from the Veterans Trust Fund, which is based on the assumption that it will receive a transfer of \$900,000 and will have \$129,275 of available interest earnings.

The Staff recommendation for Colorado State Veterans Trust Fund Expenditures is pending figure setting for tobacco settlement programs, which will project an amount of tobacco settlement revenue that will be received by the Trust for FY 2012-13. Staff will add projected interest earnings of \$129,275 to 90% of the projected transfer to compute the recommended appropriation.

<u>Western Slope Military Veterans Cemetery</u>. This line item provides funding for personal services costs for the employees who operate and maintain the cemetery, as well as for cemetery operating costs such as utilities, routine maintenance, minor construction and improvement, and administrative costs. The following table presents the staffing summary.

Operations and maintenance agreement for Buckley/Greeley. This line item provides state General Fund support and reflects federal support for the operations and maintenance costs of the Air National Guard activities that are housed at Buckley Air Force Base and Greeley. It funds personal services, operating expenses, and utilities. The proportion of General Fund and federal

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funds is based on the annual cooperative agreement between the Department and the U.S. Department of Defense.

(4) FEDERAL FUNDED PROGRAMS

This section is included for information only. It describes federal funding that is managed by the Department but which is not subject to state appropriation and does not flow through the state accounting system. These programs provide training one weekend per month and two weeks per year for members of the Colorado National Guard. The request reflects recent levels of federal funding. These expenses are not subject to the 2.5 percent PERA contribution adjustment.

Staff recommends reflecting an appropriation \$205,646,369 federal funds and 1,239.0 FTE.

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LONG BILL FOOTNOTES

41 Department of Military and Veterans Affairs, Federal Funded Programs -- These federal funds are shown for informational purposes. These funds are not to be included in the spending authority for the Department because these funds do not flow through the accounting systems of the state. It is the intent of the General Assembly that these programs, funding, and FTE are included to demonstrate the full scope of activities in the Department of Military Affairs.

Comment: Staff recommends that this footnote, which has been included in the Long Bill since at least FY 2001-02, be included in the FY 2012-13 Long Bill.
