SUBJECT Summary of Long Bill Amendments and Status of 2023 Budget Package Bills

# LONG BILL (S.B. 23-214)

#### SENATE ACTION

The JBC Staff prepared a packet of 50 Long Bill amendments for the Senate. Of the 37 amendments that were offered, 17 were adopted. In total, these amendments increase General Fund appropriations for FY 2023-24 by \$84.9 million, including:

- \$84,928,021 General Fund;
- \$20,000 cash funds from the Division of Insurance Cash Fund; and
- \$500,000 federal funds.

#### HOUSE ACTION

The JBC Staff prepared a packet of 74 Long Bill amendments for the House. Of the 62 amendments that were offered, 25 were adopted. **The House retained 13 of the 17 Senate amendments** (with two of these amendments modified). **The House also adopted 12 additional amendments.** 

Compared to the introduced version of the Long Bill, the rerevised (House) version of the Long Bill increases appropriations for FY 2023-24 by a total of \$111.0 million. This increase includes:

- \$107,986,517 General Fund;
- \$20,000 cash funds from the Division of Insurance Cash Fund;
- \$2,000,000 reappropriated funds; and
- \$1,000,000 federal funds.

The table that begins on page four (Attachment A) lists all of the amendments adopted by the House and Senate, categorized as follows:

- Amendments (11) that are included in both the Senate and House versions;
- Senate amendments (2) that were adopted in a modified form by the House;
- Amendments (4) that were adopted by the Senate but not retained by the House; and
- Amendments (12) that were adopted by the House but not the Senate.

#### BUDGET PACKAGE BILLS

Of the 32 JBC-sponsored bills that were introduced as a package with the Long Bill (SB 23-215 through SB 23-246), 31 have been adopted by both chambers. Senate Bill 23-232 was introduced in the House on April 5. Seven of the 32 bills have been amended by one or both chambers, as described below.

\$4.7 million in unspent money transferred and appropriated for FY 2021-22 for air quality improvement grants must not be used for that purpose and instead must be used for financial assistance as provided in the "Building Excellent Schools Today Act". The bill also repeals the scheduled transfer of \$30.0 million from the Marijuana Tax Cash Fund to the Public School Capital Construction Assistance Fund on June 1, 2023.

## Senate Amendments

The Senate Appropriations Committee adopted sponsor amendment L.001 to insert the number of the bill into the text of the bill. This amendment was adopted by the Senate on second reading.

#### House Amendment

The House adopted sponsor amendment L.003, which transfers on June 1, 2023, \$1,000,000 from the General Fund to the Public School Capital Construction Assistance Fund.

- S.B. 23-227: State Agency Attorney Hourly Rate. The bill creates a mechanism to set the hourly rate for attorneys who contract with the Office of Alternate Defense Counsel, the Office of the Child's Representative, or the Office of the Respondent Parents' Counsel. The Senate Appropriations Committee adopted sponsor amendment L.001 to modify provisions concerning the Office of the Alternate Defense Counsel to clarify that the Office's schedule of rates (rather than a single rate) will all adjust in proportion to the target rate. This amendment was adopted by the Senate on second reading.
- S.B. 23-228: Office of Administrative Services for Independent Agencies. The bill creates an independent administrative support office to support independent agencies within the Judicial Department. The House adopted sponsor amendment L.004, which includes technical clarifications related to the responsibilities of the Office Director and the administrative board for S.B. 23-228. These clarifications were requested by the independent agencies.
- S.B. 23-229: Statewide Behavioral Health Court Liaison Office. The bill makes the Bridges Program within the Judicial Department an independent office and provides funding to expand the office. The House adopted two amendments:
  - O Sponsor amendment L.002 adds the Director of the Office of Civil and Forensic Mental Health (OCFMH, an office within the Department of Human Services) to the Bridges Commission. Additionally, in order to retain an odd number of Commission members and ensure that public members comprise a majority of the Commission, the amendment also adds an additional public member appointed by the Chief Justice. The effect of these two amendments is to increase the Commission from nine to 11 members, including five specified members and six appointed members.
  - O Sponsor amendment L.003 adds: (1) language clarifying that the Bridges Program and Bridges liaisons are to avoid duplication and bifurcation of services in their relationship with the OCFMH; and (2) specified data points for the annual report that include competency status and outcomes and data related to participant diversion from competency services, custody/incarceration, and criminal justice involvement.

- S.B. 23-232: Unemployment Insurance Premiums Allocation Fed Law Compliance. The bill modifies unemployment insurance premiums and surcharges to bring the Employment Support Fund into federal compliance. It also refinances certain appropriations for the Department of Labor and Employment, substituting cash funds for General Fund, starting in FY 2023-24. The House adopted five amendments as described below.
  - o L.001 and L.002 adjust language in the bill with no substantive impacts; and
  - L.005, L.006, and L.007 eliminate the appropriation clause to remove the refinance of \$899,537 in General Fund appropriations with Employment Support Fund in FY 2023-24, and amend the allowable uses of the Employment Support Fund to no longer fund labor standards, labor relations, and the Colorado works grievance procedure beginning in FY 2025-26. Compared to the introduced bill, these amendments increase General Fund appropriations for FY 2023-24 by \$899,537.
- S.B. 23-236: Electric Vehicle Service Equipment Fund. The bill creates the Electric Vehicle Service Equipment Fund, to consist of money received by the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs for the charging of electric vehicles at the Department's charging sites. The Senate Appropriations Committee adopted amendment J.001 to make technical corrections to the appropriation clause. This amendment was adopted by the Senate on second reading.
- S.B. 23-241: Creation of Office of School Safety. The bill creates the Office of School Safety in the Executive Director's Office of the Department of Public Safety.

## Senate Amendments

- O Sponsor amendment L.002 made a technical correction to a section number;
- Sponsor amendment L.007 amended the existing School Security Disbursement Program to allow for disbursement funds to be used to implement a co-responder program;
- Sponsor amendment L.009 amended the duties of the existing School Safety Resource Center to specify that nothing in the relevant subsection permits providing a firearm to a school district or a school;
- L.006 amended the existing School Security Disbursement Program to allow for disbursement funds to be used to implement a school resource officer program; and,
- L.010 amended the appropriation clause to increase the General Fund appropriation to the School Security Disbursement Program from \$6.0 million to \$16.0 million. This change increases General Fund appropriations for FY 2023-24 by \$10,000,000.

## House Amendments

- Sponsor amendment L.012 extended the repeal date for the School Access for Emergency Response (SAFER) grant program from July 1, 2024 to July 1, 2029;
- Sponsor amendment L.013 made a technical change to align Senate amendments and place the program changes adopted through L.006 and L.007 in the same section of the bill;
- L.016 creates the Youth Violence Prevention Grant Program and includes a one-time General Fund appropriation to support the grant program. This change increases General Fund appropriations for FY 2023-24 by \$1,000,000; and
- L.019 removes language that states the responsibilities of the new Office include any duties as
  deemed necessary by the Executive Director of the Department of Public Safety, and instead
  limits duties to the implementation of the section that creates the Office.
