Mike Dohr explained the purpose of the Title 12 Recodification Study, referred to discussion of articles listed above, and asked for suggestions for relocating those articles.

Article 14—Fair Debt Collection Practices Act; Article 14. 1—Child Support Collection Consumer Protection Act; Article14.3 —Consumer Credit Reporting Act; Article 14.5—Debt-management Services

Julie Meade suggested relocating Articles 14, 14.1, 14.3, and 14.5 to Title 5; Dept. of Law representatives expressed agreement that relocating is appropriate. Ms. Meade explained the connection between those articles and the Consumer Credit Code in Title 5, which she is the administrator of, as well as the articles.

Ed DeCecco asked whether the relocation would require updates to rules and forms and whether that would be complex or have a fiscal impact.

Ms. Meade agreed that there are lots of rules and forms but updating them would not be a problem.

Jack Wylie indicated that the Controller does not have a position at this time but offered to take the ideas back for feedback; Mr. Wylie also added that the Controller is looking to update central collection services through legislation, possibly in 2018.

James Bailey had no formal feedback at this time but didn't really see a problem with relocating the Child Support Act to Title 5.

Article 44.5—Indian Arts & Crafts Sales

Alissa Gardenswartz suggested relocating to Title 18 because of the criminal elements.

Ed DeCecco asked about the right of action section - Section 12-44.5-108.

Christy Chase asked if Ms. Gardenswartz would oppose moving the article to Title 6, Consumer and Commercial Affairs.

Ms. Gardenswartz did not object but thought Title 18 was a better fit because of the criminal element; she offered to consider Article 44.5 further and provide feedback or suggestions via email.
