A Current picture:

Logan County currently has 59 Child Welfare cases open.

80% or 47 cases are open because of Methamphetamine use as the primary factor.

Of the 59 open cases, 30%, or 18 cases involve the familial description of HB19-1193 as being either a pregnancy or within the 1 year age of the infant and all 18 cases were opened as a direct result of Methamphetamine use as the primary factor.

Of the 18 within this past year, only 1 child has been successfully reunited with the biological parent.

Historically from 2013- present, 75-85% of all Child Welfare cases in Logan County are due to the use of Methamphetamines as the primary factor.
