

**STATE SENATE TESTIMONY**

My name is John Sampson. I am a retired Immigration and Customs Enforcement agent with over 27 years experience in immigration law enforcement. Prior to that, I was a police officer in NY. I hold a BA cum laude from Long Island University with a major in Criminal Justice and a minor in Psychology. I attended Thomas M. Cooley Law School in Lansing, MI for two years. I come before you today in full and unequivocal support of the legislation proposed by Senators Neville and Marble.

Despite the latest headlines in the Denver Post, publishing a letter from Mayor Michael Hancock addressed to Acting ICE Field Office Director Jeff Lynch, this issue continues to be accusatory with finger pointing ruling the day. In fact, given the inaccuracies, misstatements, and outright falsehoods contained in Mayor Hancock's letter, all this has done is further exacerbate an already highly contentious issue.

Allow me to point out to you the factual errors in Mayor Hancock's letter. First, the letter objects to the arrest of CRIMINAL illegal aliens in

the Denver Courthouse by ICE. This is a direct result of the Denver County Sheriff refusal to honor ICE detainers as in the case involving Ever VALLES who is accused of killing Tim CRUZ at an RTD station. I never thought I would ever see the day where cops would tell other cops to go "pound sand" when asked for assistance. This is beyond deplorable. This is despicable and it has resulted in an innocent man being killed and the people responsible for this insane Sanctuary policy must be held accountable. But I digress.

The concern expressed in the letter is that by arresting CRIMINAL illegal aliens in Courthouses, it will result in witnesses and victims refusing to assist law enforcement in the enforcement of the law. Much like the sheriffs of Colorado refusing to assist immigration authorities in the enforcement of the law, I suppose. The belief is that by so doing, ICE will be responsible for forcing the release of "violent criminals" onto the streets. Ironically, it's akin to Sheriffs releasing violent criminals on the street by refusing to honor ICE detainers. I refer you to the cases of Ever VALLES, and Francis HERNANDEZ, to mention just two. There are two words to describe this: "Abject hypocrisy", specious claims of Fourth Amendment concerns to the contrary notwithstanding.



The other "concern" that his honor, the Mayor, listed in his letter about ICE arresting CRIMINAL aliens in the courthouse is that victims and witnesses would refuse to testify for fear of being arrested and deported. Categorically not true, and he should know that.

Since 2000, there has been a Victim of Crime Visa or U Visa that's been available from USCIS to address this very issue. And the local law enforcement agencies have absolutely no problem cooperating with USCIS in helping illegal aliens who claim to be the victims of crime to get a visa enabling them to stay in the US. Since its enactment, there have been more than 170,000 U Visa applications.

As for witnesses, since 1994, there has been an S Visa for informants and witnesses. It is similar to the U Visa I mentioned previously.

I guess we have "selective cooperation". The Sheriffs say they don't want deputies to become immigration officers, but yet they task their deputies to assist illegal aliens in getting U visas and/or S Visas. If that's

not being an immigration officer, I don't know what is. Again, the two words to describe this are: "Abject Hypocrisy".

The March 14, 2017 so-called "raid" conducted "adjacent" to a "school's campus", namely the Colorado High School Charter, located at 1175 Osage Street, Denver, Colorado, was, in fact, not a raid. It was a fugitive operation seeking to arrest a single criminal alien who had been ordered deported from the United States by an Immigration Judge and failed to surrender for removal as required by the law.

Policy dictates that ICE agent ensure the area in which they are operating is not directly visible from a school. There were no schools listed on the GOOGLE Map search conducted by ICE. In fact, the building at 1175 Osage Street is The Osage Building, which houses several law firms as well as the Colorado High School Charter, an industrial office building.

At the end of the day, this letter is just one more piece of emotional propaganda, full of misstatements, inaccuracies, misinformation, contrived moral outrage, scare tactics, and, sad to say, outright lies. It is

emblematic of the tactics used by open border advocates and immigrant rights activists, seeking validation for their indefensible agenda, an agenda that runs counter to the sentiment of the vast majority of Americans who demand that our immigration laws be enforced.

Last, but not least, Sanctuary policies are in direct violation of Title 8 United States Code, Section 1324, which makes it a federal felony to harbor, smuggle, traffic, transport, assist or enable illegal aliens in avoiding detection, arrest, and removal from the United States. In effect, the inconvenient truth is that anyone who engages in Sanctuary policies, or the politics of contraband, is committing the same crime as an alien smuggler or human trafficker.

I could go on, and address the entire issue of detainers, and the Ever VALLES and Francisco HERNANDEZ issues, but time constraints limit my presentation. I would be willing, however, to answer any questions you may have on that, or any other issue.

### (a) CRIMINAL PENALTIES

#### (1)

##### (A) Any person who—

(i) knowing that a person is an alien, brings to or attempts to bring to the United States in any manner whatsoever such person at a place other than a designated port of entry or place other than as designated by the Commissioner, regardless of whether such alien has received prior official authorization to come to, enter, or reside in the United States and regardless of any future official action which may be taken with respect to such alien;

(ii) knowing or in reckless disregard of the fact that an alien has come to, entered, or remains in the United States in violation of law, transports, or moves or attempts to transport or move such alien within the United States by means of transportation or otherwise, in furtherance of such violation of law;

(iii) knowing or in reckless disregard of the fact that an alien has come to, entered, or remains in the United States in violation of law, conceals, harbors, or shields from detection, or attempts to conceal, harbor, or shield from detection, such alien in any place, including any building or any means of transportation;

(iv) encourages or induces an alien to come to, enter, or reside in the United States, knowing or in reckless disregard of the fact that such coming to, entry, or residence is or will be in violation of law; or

#### (v)

(i) engages in any conspiracy to commit any of the preceding acts, or

(ii) aids or abets the commission of any of the preceding acts,

shall be punished as provided in subparagraph (B).

(B) A person who violates subparagraph (A) shall, for each alien in respect to whom such a violation occurs—

(i) in the case of a violation of subparagraph (A)(i) or (v)(i) or in the case of a violation of subparagraph (A)(ii), (iii), or (iv) in which the offense was done for the purpose of commercial advantage or private financial gain, be fined under title 18, imprisoned not more than 10 years, or both;

(ii) in the case of a violation of subparagraph (A)(ii), (iii), (iv), or (v)(ii), be fined under title 18, imprisoned not more than 5 years, or both;

(iii) in the case of a violation of subparagraph (A)(i), (ii), (iii), (iv), or (v) during and in relation to which the person causes serious bodily injury (as defined in section 1365 of title 18) (/uscodes/text/18/1365) to, or places in jeopardy the life of, any person, be fined under title 18, imprisoned not more than 20 years, or both; and

(iv) in the case of a violation of subparagraph (A)(i), (ii), (iii), (iv), or (v) resulting in the death of any person, be punished by death or imprisoned for any term of years or for life, fined under title 18, or both.

(C) It is not a violation of clauses (i) or (ii) of subparagraph (A), or of clause (iv) of subparagraph (A)

except where a person encourages or induces an alien to come to or enter the United States, for a religious denomination having a bona fide nonprofit, religious organization in the United States, or the agents or officers of such denomination or organization, to encourage, invite, call, allow, or enable an alien who is present in the United States to perform the vocation of a minister or missionary for the denomination or organization in the United States as a volunteer who is not compensated as an employee, notwithstanding the provision of room, board, travel, medical assistance, and other basic living expenses, provided the minister or missionary has been a member of the denomination for at least one year.

(2) Any person who, knowing or in reckless disregard of the fact that an alien has not received prior official authorization to come to, enter, or reside in the United States, brings to or attempts to bring to the United States in any manner whatsoever, such alien, regardless of any official action which may later be taken with respect to such alien shall, for each alien in respect to whom a violation of this paragraph occurs—

(A) be fined in accordance with title 18 or imprisoned not more than one year, or both; or

(B) in the case of—

(i) an offense committed with the intent or with reason to believe that the alien unlawfully brought into the United States will commit an offense against the United States or any State punishable by imprisonment for more than 1 year,

(ii) an offense done for the purpose of commercial advantage or private financial gain, or

(iii) an offense in which the alien is not upon arrival immediately brought and presented to an appropriate immigration officer at a designated port of entry,

be fined under title 18 and shall be imprisoned, in the case of a first or second violation of subparagraph (B)(i), not more than 10 years, in the case of a first or second violation of subparagraph (B)(ii) or (B)(iii), not less than 3 nor more than 10 years, and for any other violation, not less than 5 nor more than 15 years.

(3)

(A) Any person who, during any 12-month period, knowingly hires for employment at least 10 individuals with actual knowledge that the individuals are aliens described in subparagraph (B) shall be fined under title 18 or imprisoned for not more than 5 years, or both.

(B) An alien described in this subparagraph is an alien who—

(i) is an unauthorized alien (as defined in section 1324a(h)(3) of this title ([/uscode/text/8/usc:18:1324a:h:3](#))), and

(ii) has been brought into the United States in violation of this subsection.

(4) In the case of a person who has brought aliens into the United States in violation of this subsection, the sentence otherwise provided for may be increased by up to 10 years if—

(A) the offense was part of an ongoing commercial organization or enterprise;

(B) aliens were transported in groups of 10 or more; and

(C)

(i) aliens were transported in a manner that endangered their lives; or

(ii) the aliens presented a life-threatening health risk to people in the United States.

(b) SEIZURE AND FORFEITURE

(1) IN GENERAL

Any conveyance, including any vessel, vehicle, or aircraft, that has been or is being used in the commission of a violation of subsection (a), the gross proceeds of such violation, and any property traceable to such conveyance or proceeds, shall be seized and subject to forfeiture.

(2) APPLICABLE PROCEDURES

Seizures and forfeitures under this subsection shall be governed by the provisions of chapter 46 of title 18 ([/uscode/text/18/usc:18:ch:46](#)) relating to civil forfeitures, including section 981(d) of such title, except that such duties as are imposed upon the Secretary of the Treasury under the customs laws described in that section shall be performed by such officers, agents, and other persons as may be designated for that purpose by the Attorney General.

(3) PRIMA FACIE EVIDENCE IN DETERMINATIONS OF VIOLATIONS In determining whether a violation of subsection (a) has occurred, any of the following shall be prima facie evidence that an alien involved in the alleged violation had not received prior official authorization to come to, enter, or reside in the United States or that

such alien had come to, entered, or remained in the United States in violation of law:

(A) Records of any judicial or administrative proceeding in which that alien's status was an issue and in which it was determined that the alien had not received prior official authorization to come to, enter, or reside in the United States or that such alien had come to, entered, or remained in the United States in violation of law.

(B) Official records of the Service or of the Department of State showing that the alien had not received prior official authorization to come to, enter, or reside in the United States or that such alien had come to, entered, or remained in the United States in violation of law.

(C) Testimony, by an immigration officer having personal knowledge of the facts concerning that alien's status, that the alien had not received prior official authorization to come to, enter, or reside in the United States or that such alien had come to, entered, or remained in the United States in violation of law.

**(c) AUTHORITY TO ARREST**

No officer or person shall have authority to make any arrests for a violation of any provision of this section except officers and employees of the Service designated by the Attorney General, either individually or as a member of a class, and all other officers whose duty it is to enforce criminal laws.

**(d) ADMISSIBILITY OF VIDEOTAPED WITNESS TESTIMONY**

Notwithstanding any provision of the Federal Rules of Evidence, the videotaped (or otherwise audiovisually preserved) deposition of a witness to a violation of subsection (a) who has been deported or otherwise expelled from the United States, or is otherwise unable to testify, may be admitted into evidence in an action brought for that violation if the witness was available for cross examination and the deposition otherwise complies with the Federal Rules of Evidence.

**(e) OUTREACH PROGRAM**

The Secretary of Homeland Security, in consultation with the Attorney General and the Secretary of State, as appropriate, shall develop and implement an outreach program to educate the public in the United States and abroad about the penalties for bringing in and harboring aliens in violation of this section.

**(a) IN GENERAL**

Notwithstanding any other provision of Federal, State, or local law, a Federal, State, or local government entity or official may not prohibit, or in any way restrict, any government entity or official from sending to, or receiving from, the Immigration and Naturalization Service information regarding the citizenship or immigration status, lawful or unlawful, of any individual.

**(b) ADDITIONAL AUTHORITY OF GOVERNMENT ENTITIES** Notwithstanding any other provision of Federal, State, or local law, no person or agency may prohibit, or in any way restrict, a Federal, State, or local government entity from doing any of the following with respect to information regarding the immigration status, lawful or unlawful, of any individual:

- (1) Sending such information to, or requesting or receiving such information from, the Immigration and Naturalization Service.
- (2) Maintaining such information.
- (3) Exchanging such information with any other Federal, State, or local government entity.

**(c) OBLIGATION TO RESPOND TO INQUIRIES**

The Immigration and Naturalization Service shall respond to an inquiry by a Federal, State, or local government agency, seeking to verify or ascertain the citizenship or immigration status of any individual within the jurisdiction of the agency for any purpose authorized by law, by providing the requested verification or status information.
