

- 1 Amend printed bill, page 4, strike lines 2 through 14.
- 2 Reletter succeeding paragraphs accordingly.
- 3 Page 4, after line 18 insert:
 - 4 "(e) There is growing evidence of the harms of inappropriately prescribing benzodiazepines, especially long-term prescribing for acute conditions, which contributes to physical dependence and potential for misuse, drug interactions, or overdose;
 - 8 (f) Although Colorado's opioid prescription limit explicitly exempts certain diagnoses, including cancer and chronic pain, many chronic pain patients have nonetheless found their prescriptions limited;
 - 12 (g) There are many legitimate uses of opioids and benzodiazepines, especially for patients with chronic conditions, and limiting access for these patients can cause considerable harm, especially when they are titrated too rapidly;".

- 16 Page 4, line 19, strike "Chances" and substitute "Notwithstanding the legitimate uses of these medications, chances".
- 18 Page 4, strike lines 20 through 27 and substitute "benzodiazepines; and".
- 19 Page 5, strike line 1.
- 20 Reletter succeeding paragraphs accordingly.
- 21 Page 5, line 2, strike "Medical education" and substitute "Education".
- 22 Page 5, strike line 7 through 12 and substitute:
 - 23 "(a) Reduce out-of-pocket costs for physical therapy, occupational therapy, chiropractic services, and acupuncture services;
 - 25 (b) Remove barriers to coverage of atypical opioids, such as buprenorphine, tramadol, and tapentadol;
 - 27 (c) Continue to limit opioid prescriptions and require prescribers to query the prescription drug monitoring program (PDMP);
 - 29 (d) Establish limits on benzodiazepine prescriptions for certain conditions and require prescribers to query the PDMP;
 - 31 (e) Make it easier for providers to query the PDMP by integrating it into electronic health records systems;".
