This bill prohibits a state agency and its employees from assisting a federal agency in arresting a Colorado citizen under certain circumstances. Beginning in the current year FY 2017-18, this bill impacts state agency workload by a minimal amount on an ongoing basis.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status: This fiscal note reflects the introduced bill. This bill was not enacted into law; therefore, the impacts identified in this analysis do not take effect.

Summary of Legislation

This bill prohibits a state agency and its employees from knowingly assisting a federal agency in arresting a Colorado citizen for an act that is a Colorado constitutional right or violates his or her Colorado constitutional rights. The bill defines a Colorado constitutional right as a right that has not been declared unconstitutional by a federal or Colorado appellate court.

State Expenditures

Beginning in the current year FY 2017-18, this bill increases state agency workload to determine if a request from a federal agency violates a Colorado citizen's constitutional rights. To the extent that such requests are determined to violate a Colorado citizen's constitutional rights, state agency workload may decrease from denying the request. This workload impact is expected to be minimal and will not require a change in appropriations for any state agency.

Effective Date

This bill was postponed indefinitely by the House Judiciary Committee on February 1, 2018.
