The State, Veterans, and Military Affairs Committee Report (02/15/18) includes amendments to the bill. Legislative Council Staff and JBC Staff agree that the committee amendments reduce the revenue impact from at least \$10,000 in FY 2018-19 to at least \$5,000 in FY 2018-19.

**Description of Amendments in This Packet**

**J.001** Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of \$1,401,432 General Fund to the Department of Corrections for FY 2020-21 through FY 2022-23.

**Points to Consider**

This bill requires \$1,401,432 in statutory appropriations from the General Fund to the Department of Corrections from FY 2020-21 through FY 2022-23. These appropriations and transfers reduce the amount of General Fund available for other purposes.
