Summary Information

Overview. The bill eliminates the Homeless Prevention Activities Program Advisory Committee.

Summary of Legislation

The bill eliminates the Homeless Prevention Activities Program Advisory Committee, requiring the Department of Local Affairs (DOLA) to administer homeless prevention activities program without the committee's oversight.

State Expenditures

The bill minimally impacts state workload as described below.

Department of Local Affairs

Workload for DOLA will be minimally impacted to administer homeless prevention activities program without the committee's oversight. Workload may increase to perform work previously performed by the committee and workload may decrease as administrative processes are streamlined. No change in appropriations is required.

Department of Human Services

Workload for the Department of Human Services will minimally decrease for its staff to no longer serve on the committee. Since the department assumed this responsibility within existing resources, no change in appropriations is required.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
