### Summary Information

**Overview.** The bill makes a technical revision to language from Senate Bill 25-070 regarding online marketplace's obligation to alert law enforcement regarding the sale or attempted sale of stolen goods.

**No fiscal impacts.** The bill has no fiscal impact on state or local government.

**Appropriations.** No appropriation is required.

## Summary of Legislation

---

The bill makes a technical revision to language from [Senate Bill 25-070](#) by changing “attempting to sell” to “selling or attempting to sell,” to match the rest of the bill. This clarifies an online marketplace's obligation to alert law enforcement if the online marketplace knows or should have known that a third-party seller is selling or attempting to sell stolen goods to a consumer in Colorado.

## Assessment of No Fiscal Impact

---

The bill only makes a clarifying technical revision, which does not change to state or local government revenue or expenditures. For this reason, the bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

## Effective Date

---

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
