Summary Information

Overview. The bill allows physical therapists to perform physical examinations that are required for participation in certain high school team athletic activities.

Types of impacts. The bill is projected to affect the following areas on an ongoing basis:

Summary of Legislation

If a statewide high school activities association requires a physical examination to participate in team athletics, the bill requires the association to allow the examination to be performed by a licensed physical therapist.

State Expenditures

The bill will minimally increase workload in the Colorado Department of Education and Department of Regulatory Agencies for rulemaking and outreach to high school activities associations and physical therapists, respectively. This workload can be absorbed within existing resources.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
