Fiscal Assessment of L.001 to HB26-1265

This memorandum is an assessment of the fiscal impact of the attached proposed amendment L.001 to House Bill 26-1265. This fiscal assessment is for the impact of the bill with inclusion of this amendment only. Any other added amendment could influence the fiscal impact.

Summary of Proposed Amendment

Amendment L.001 strikes the requirement that other state law enforcement agencies report to the Colorado Bureau of Investigation (CBI) within the Department of Public Safety (CDPS) all information those agencies provide to and receive from the eTrace system as part of the Uniform Crime Reporting program. It also allows a local law enforcement agency to use the eTrace system through a preexisting relationship with another local law enforcement agency.

Fiscal Impact of Amendment

Because CBI is no longer required to receive reports from law enforcement, Amendment L.001 eliminates the costs for the CDPS identified in the fiscal note published February 25, 2026.

Bill's Revised Fiscal Impact with Amendment

With the adoption of Amendment L.001, no appropriation is required. The bill may have minimal state and local workload impacts to state and local law enforcement agencies to ensure each recovered firearm is entered into the eTrace system.
