Summary Information

Overview. The bill clarifies that court costs should not apply to juveniles under the purview of the district court.

Types of impacts. The bill is projected to affect the following areas on an ongoing basis:

Summary of Legislation

[House Bill 21-1315](#) prohibited courts from assessing certain fines and fees on individuals under the jurisdiction of the juvenile court, and prohibited the collection of the balance of any court-assessed or court-ordered costs against anyone who committed an offense before the age of 18, and sentenced before the age of 21. The later scenario applies to all juveniles, including those who were prosecuted as adults (i.e., under the jurisdiction of a district court), while the former scenario only applies to juvenile delinquency cases. This bill clarifies that the prohibition of assessing certain court fines and fees also apply to juveniles who were prosecuted as adults.

State Expenditures

Workload in the Judicial Department will minimally decrease as the department will no longer be required to manually ensure that these cases were not sent to collections. No change in appropriations is required.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
