A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING REGULATION OF THE DIVISION OF PROFESSIONS AND**
102 **OCCUPATIONS, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH,**
103 **IMPLEMENTING RECOMMENDATIONS CONTAINED IN THE 2025**
104 **SUNSET REPORT BY THE DEPARTMENT OF REGULATORY**
105 **AGENCIES.**

Bill Summary

regulatory agencies' sunset review and report on the division of professions and occupations in the department of regulatory agencies.

Sections 1 and 2 of the bill allow a regulator to delegate authority for administrative tasks authorized by statute or other tasks specifically authorized through the policy of a board or commission to a designee at the regulator's discretion.

Section 3 changes the amount of time a licensee, certificate holder, or registrant (licensee) who receives a letter of admonition has to request a hearing to within 25 days after the date of issuance of the letter of admonition, rather than within 20 days after receipt of the letter.

Sections 3 through 22 clarify that a regulator may provide communications to licensees through email.

Section 23 raises the amount of the excise tax on renewal fees from \$1 to \$2. The money goes to the legal defense account created within the division of professions and occupations cash fund.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-20-102, **amend**
3 (1); and **add** (1.5) as follows:

4 **12-20-102. Definitions.**

5 As used in this title 12, unless the context otherwise requires:

6 (1) ~~"Applicant" means a person applying, pursuant to a part or~~
7 ~~article of this title 12, for a new license, certification, or registration or to~~
8 ~~renew, reinstate, or reactivate a license, certification, or registration that~~
9 ~~is authorized pursuant to that part or article~~ "ADMINISTRATIVE TASK"
10 MEANS A TASK THAT IS MINISTERIAL OR ADMINISTRATIVE IN NATURE, THAT
11 HAS A FIXED AND CERTAIN STANDARD, AND THAT DOES NOT REQUIRE A
12 SUBORDINATE EMPLOYEE TO EXERCISE SIGNIFICANT JUDGMENT OR
13 DISCRETION.

14 (1.5) "APPLICANT" MEANS A PERSON APPLYING, PURSUANT TO A
15 PART OR ARTICLE OF THIS TITLE 12, FOR A NEW LICENSE, CERTIFICATION,
16 OR REGISTRATION OR TO RENEW, REINSTATE, OR REACTIVATE A LICENSE,
17 CERTIFICATION, OR REGISTRATION THAT IS AUTHORIZED PURSUANT TO

1 THAT PART OR ARTICLE.

2 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **add** 12-20-409 as
3 follows:

4 **12-20-409. Delegation of administrative tasks.**

5 (1) A REGULATOR MAY DELEGATE AUTHORITY FOR
6 ADMINISTRATIVE TASKS AUTHORIZED BY THIS TITLE 12 OR OTHER TASKS
7 SPECIFICALLY AUTHORIZED THROUGH THE POLICY OF A BOARD OR
8 COMMISSION TO A DESIGNEE AT THE REGULATOR'S DISCRETION.

9 (2) NOTWITHSTANDING SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION, UNLESS
10 A REGULATOR IDENTIFIES SPECIFIC CRITERIA TO GOVERN THE REGULATOR'S
11 DELEGATE IN MAKING A DETERMINATION, A REGULATOR SHALL NOT
12 DELEGATE THE FOLLOWING TASKS:

13 (a) DENIAL, REFUSAL TO RENEW, REVOCATION, OR SUSPENSION OF
14 THE LICENSE, CERTIFICATION, OR REGISTRATION OF AN APPLICANT,
15 LICENSEE, CERTIFICATE HOLDER, OR REGISTRANT IN ACCORDANCE WITH
16 SECTION 12-20-404 (1)(d)(I);

17 (b) COMMENCEMENT OF A HEARING ON AN ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE
18 IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 12-20-405 (2)(c)(I); OR

19 (c) APPLICATION FOR INJUNCTION IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION
20 12-20-406.

21 (3) ALL TASKS DELEGATED PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION BY A
22 REGULATOR THAT IS NOT THE DIRECTOR MUST BE RATIFIED AT THE NEXT
23 MEETING OF THE RELEVANT REGULATORY BOARD OR COMMISSION.

24 **SECTION 3.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-20-404, **amend**
25 (4)(a), (4)(b)(I), and (5)(a) as follows:

26 **12-20-404. Disciplinary actions - regulator powers -**
27 **disposition of fines - mistreatment of at-risk adult - exceptions -**

1 **definitions.**

2 (4) **Letter of admonition.**

3 (a) When a complaint or investigation discloses an instance of
4 misconduct that, in the opinion of a regulator, does not warrant formal
5 action by the regulator but that should not be dismissed as being without
6 merit, the regulator may issue and send a letter of admonition to the
7 licensee, certificate holder, or registrant. A LETTER SENT PURSUANT TO
8 THIS SUBSECTION (4)(a) MAY BE SENT BY EMAIL.

9 (b) (I) When a regulator sends a letter of admonition to a licensee,
10 certificate holder, or registrant pursuant to subsection (4)(a) of this
11 section, the regulator shall also advise the licensee, certificate holder, or
12 registrant that the person has the right to request in writing, within ~~twenty~~
13 TWENTY-FIVE CALENDAR days after ~~receipt~~ ISSUANCE of the letter, that the
14 regulator initiate formal disciplinary proceedings to adjudicate the
15 propriety of the conduct upon which the letter of admonition is based.

16 (5) **Confidential letter of concern.**

17 (a) When a complaint or investigation discloses an instance of
18 conduct that does not warrant formal action by a regulator and, in the
19 opinion of the regulator, should be dismissed, but the regulator has
20 noticed indications of possible errant conduct by the licensee, certificate
21 holder, or registrant that could lead to serious consequences if not
22 corrected, the regulator may or shall, in accordance with the part or article
23 of this title 12 governing the particular profession or occupation, send the
24 licensee, certificate holder, or registrant a confidential letter of concern.
25 A LETTER SENT PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION (5)(a) MAY BE SENT BY
26 EMAIL.

27 **SECTION 4.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-20-202, **add** (7)

1 as follows:

2 **12-20-202. Licenses, certifications, and registrations - renewal**
3 **- reinstatement - fees - occupational credential portability program**
4 **- exceptions for military personnel, spouses, gold star military**
5 **spouses, and dependents - rules - consideration of criminal**
6 **convictions or driver's history - executive director authority - email**
7 **communications - definitions.**

8 (7) **Email communications.** NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER
9 PROVISION OF THIS TITLE 12, A REGULATOR MAY PROVIDE
10 COMMUNICATIONS REQUIRED BY THIS TITLE 12 THROUGH EMAIL.

11 **SECTION 5.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-20-405, **amend**
12 (2)(b) as follows:

13 **12-20-405. Cease-and-desist orders.**

14 (2) (b) The regulator shall promptly notify the person of the
15 issuance of the order to show cause and shall include in the notice a copy
16 of the order, the factual and legal basis for the order, and the date set by
17 the regulator for a hearing on the order. The regulator may serve the
18 notice by EMAIL, BY personal service, by first-class United States mail,
19 postage prepaid, or as may be practicable upon any person against whom
20 the order is issued. Personal service, EMAIL, or proof of receipt of mailing
21 of an order or document pursuant to this subsection (2)(b) constitutes
22 notice to the person of the existence and contents of the order or
23 document.

24 **SECTION 6.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-110-111, **amend**

1 (2) The board may issue and send a letter of admonition by
2 first-class mail OR EMAIL to a professional land surveyor or land
3 surveyor-intern at the individual's last-known address under the
4 circumstances specified in and in accordance with section 12-20-404 (4).

5 **SECTION 10.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-120-406, **amend**
6 (2) as follows:

7 **12-120-406. Disciplinary actions - grounds for discipline.**

8 (2) The board may issue and send a letter of admonition by
9 first-class mail OR EMAIL to a licensee at the licensee's last-known address
10 under the circumstances specified in and in accordance with section
11 12-20-404 (4).

12 **SECTION 11.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-130-113, **amend**
13 (2) and (3) as follows:

14 **12-130-113. Disciplinary actions by board - procedures.**

15 (2) The board may issue and send to a licensee, by certified mail
16 OR EMAIL, a written letter of admonition under the circumstances

19 licensee under the circumstances specified in section 12-20-404 (5). The
20 confidential letter of concern and notice of the issuance of the letter shall
21 be sent to the licensee by certified mail OR EMAIL. Issuance of a
22 confidential letter of concern shall not be construed to be discipline.

15 EMAIL to a chiropractor against whom a complaint was made under the
16 circumstances specified in and in accordance with section 12-20-404 (4)
17 and shall also send a copy of the letter of admonition to the person
18 making the complaint.

19 **SECTION 15.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-240-125, **amend**
20 (4)(a)(I) as follows:

21 **12-240-125. Disciplinary action by board - rules.**

22 (4) (a) (I) Written complaints relating to the conduct of a licensee
23 licensed or authorized to practice medicine in this state may be made by
24 any person or may be initiated by an inquiry panel of the board on its own
25 motion. The licensee complained of shall be given notice by first-class
26 mail OR EMAIL of the nature of the complaint and shall be given thirty
27 days to answer or explain in writing the matters described in such

1 complaint. Upon receipt of the licensee's answer or at the conclusion of
2 thirty days, whichever occurs first, the inquiry panel may take further
3 action as set forth in subsection (4)(a)(II) of this section.

22 conduct of a certified midwife licensed or authorized to practice as a
23 certified midwife in this state may be made by any person or may be
24 initiated by an inquiry panel of the board on its own motion. Unless the
25 board determines the complaint to be without merit of investigation, the
26 board shall give notice of the complaint to the nurse or certified midwife
27 complained of, by first-class mail OR EMAIL, and shall state in the notice

1 the nature of the complaint and that the failure to respond in a materially

14 mail OR EMAIL, any investigations, examinations, hearings, meetings, or
15 any other proceedings of the board related to discipline that are conducted
16 pursuant to this section are exempt from the open records provisions of
17 article 72 of title 24 requiring that the proceedings of the board be
18 conducted publicly or that the minutes or records of the board with
19 respect to action of the board taken pursuant to this section be open to
20 public inspection.

19 examination results to the board in the form of written reports. If the
20 board determines that an institution with an approved psychiatric
21 technician education program is not maintaining the standards required

24 mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested. If the institution receiving

16 **SECTION 29.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-120-313,
17 **recreate and reenact, with amendments, (1) as follows:**

18 **12-120-313. Qualifications for professional land surveyor.**

19 (1) (a) AN APPLICANT MAY QUALIFY FOR LICENSING AS A
20 PROFESSIONAL LAND SURVEYOR BY ENDORSEMENT AND EXAMINATION IF
21 THE APPLICANT PASSES THE APPROPRIATE EXAMINATION AS ADOPTED BY
22 THE BOARD IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 12-120-104 (3)(b) AND THE
23 EXAMINATION PERTAINING TO COLORADO LAW.

24 (b) TO BE ADMITTED TO AN EXAMINATION PURSUANT TO

14 collect fees for the following:

16 (III) APPLICATION FOR LICENSURE BY ENDORSEMENT AND
17 EXAMINATION;

18 (b) With respect to land surveyor-interns:

19 (III) APPLICATION FOR ENROLLMENT AS A LAND
20 SURVEYOR-INTERM BY ENDORSEMENT.

21 **SECTION 31. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act
22 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
23 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
24 12, 2026, if adjournment sine die is on May 13, 2026); except that, if a
25 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
26 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
27 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect

1 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
2 November 2026 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
3 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
