Summary Information

Overview. The bill transfers money from the Universal High School Scholarship Cash Fund to both the General Fund and the Colorado Economic Development Fund on June 30, 2026.

Types of impacts. The bill is projected to affect the following areas in the current FY 2025-26:

Summary of Legislation

On June 30, 2026, the bill requires two transfers from the Universal High School Scholarship Cash Fund totaling \$3.5 million:

- \$1.2 million to the Colorado Economic Development Fund; and,
- \$2.3 million to the General Fund.

Background

The Universal High School Scholarship Program was created in [Senate Bill 23-205](#). The program provides scholarships to students for postsecondary education, apprenticeships, or training related to an in-demand, high-priority postsecondary pathway. Scholarships are up to \$1,500 per student and may be used for tuition, fees, books, and equipment. The program is scheduled to be repealed on June 30, 2027, with all unexpended and unencumbered money in the program's cash fund transferred to the General Fund.

State Transfers

As shown in Table 1A, the bill transfers \$1.2 million from the Universal High School Scholarship Fund to the Colorado Economic Development Fund and \$2.3 million from the Scholarship Fund to the General Fund in the current FY 2025-26.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
