The bill directs the division of brand inspection (division) in the department of agriculture and the state board of stock inspection commissioners (board) in the department of agriculture to receive reports of lost or stolen livestock. The board, in consultation with the division, shall adopt rules, which rules must be reviewed and approved by the division, to facilitate coordination between law enforcement and livestock

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1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2           **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 35-41-101, **add** (13)  
3 as follows:

4           **35-41-101. State board of stock inspection commissioners -**  
5 **creation - brand commissioner - enterprise - bonds - lost or stolen**  
6 **livestock reports - procedures.**

7           (13)(a) THE BOARD AND THE DIVISION SHALL RECEIVE REPORTS OF  
8 LOST OR STOLEN LIVESTOCK.

9           (b) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 2026, THE DIVISION SHALL  
10 IMPLEMENT PROCEDURES THAT:

11           (I) FACILITATE THE EFFICIENT COORDINATION WITH LAW  
12 ENFORCEMENT RELATED TO REPORTS OF LOST OR STOLEN LIVESTOCK,  
13 INCLUDING PROCEDURES THAT ENSURE THE REPORTING OF STOLEN  
14 LIVESTOCK TO RELEVANT LAW ENFORCEMENT WITHIN TWENTY-FOUR  
15 HOURS OF THE DIVISION RECEIVING A REPORT OF STOLEN LIVESTOCK, AND  
16 AFTER THE DIVISION, UPON REVIEW OF THE REPORT, SUSPECTS THAT A  
17 LIVESTOCK THEFT HAS OCCURRED; AND

18           (II) ENSURE THE PUBLIC IS NOTIFIED OF LOST OR STOLEN  
19 LIVESTOCK THAT HAS BEEN REPORTED TO THE DIVISION.

20           (c) THE PROCEDURES IMPLEMENTED BY THE DIVISION PURSUANT  
21 TO SUBSECTION (13)(b) OF THIS SECTION MAY VARY BY GEOGRAPHIC  
22 REGION OF THE STATE DEPENDING ON THE REGION'S NEEDS.

23           **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly finds,  
24 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate  
25 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for

- 2 institutions.
