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A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING DEATH.**

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill makes changes to death-care related practices, including changes to:

- The practices of professionals licensed and establishments registered pursuant to the "Mortuary Science Code";
- The licensure options for professionals seeking licensure pursuant to the "Mortuary Science Code";
- The powers and duties of the director of the division of professions and occupations in connection with regulating

professionals licensed and establishments registered pursuant to the "Mortuary Science Code";

- The provisions concerning nontransplant tissue banks and the discipline of a person that has an interest in a nontransplant tissue bank;
- The abuse of a corpse as a criminal offense in regard to transporting human remains;
- The timeline for regulatory review of certain death-care related entities and provisions; and
- The process by which a licensed individual initiates, completes, responds to, or files a death certificate.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-135-103, **amend**
3 (16) and (18); **add (1.6) and** (1.8); and **recreate and reenact, with**
4 **amendments,** (10) as follows:

5 **12-135-103. Definitions - repeal.**

6 As used in this article 135, unless the context otherwise requires:

7 (1.6) "ARRANGEMENT", "ARRANGEMENTS", OR "FUNERAL
8 ARRANGEMENTS" MEANS:

9 (a) PLANNING THE DETAILS OF A FUNERAL CEREMONY OR
10 MEMORIAL SERVICE, INCLUDING PLANNING THE TIME OF SERVICE AND THE
11 TYPE OF CEREMONY OR SERVICE;

12 (b) OBTAINING THE NECESSARY INFORMATION FOR FILING A DEATH
13 CERTIFICATE;

14 (c) COMPARING OR DISCUSSING PRICES, INCLUDING THE PRICE OF
15 FUNERAL GOODS AND PRENEED CONTRACTS; OR

16 (d) PROVIDING ONSITE DIRECTION AND COORDINATION OF
17 PARTICIPANTS AND ONSITE DIRECTION, COORDINATION, AND FACILITATION
18 AT A FUNERAL CEREMONY OR MEMORIAL SERVICE.

19 (1.8) "BROKER" MEANS A PERSON THAT DOES NOT DIRECTLY

1 PROVIDE PREPARATION OF HUMAN REMAINS FOR FINAL DISPOSITION OR
2 FUNERAL SERVICES TO THE PUBLIC AND WHO PROVIDES FUNERAL SERVICES

4 (10) "DESIGNEE" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL DESIGNATED BY A
5 FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT REGISTERED IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION

7 (16) "Funeral establishment" ~~"funeral home", or "mortuary"~~
8 means:

9 (a) An establishment that DIRECTLY holds, cares for, or prepares
10 human remains prior to final disposition, including a crematory or
11 embalming room; except that this subsection (16)(a) does not apply to
12 establishments in which individuals regularly die;

13 (b) An establishment that ~~holds itself out to the general public as~~
14 ~~providing~~ DIRECTLY PROVIDES funeral goods and FUNERAL services;

15 (c) ~~Facilities~~ A FACILITY used to hold, care for, or prepare human
16 remains prior to final disposition; except that this subsection (16)(c) does
17 not apply to facilities in which individuals regularly die; or

18 (d) An establishment that DIRECTLY provides funeral or memorial
19 services to the public for compensation.

20 (18) "Funeral services" means:

21 (a) Preparation of human remains for final disposition, INCLUDING
22 REFRIGERATION, EMBALMING, AND MEMORIAL SERVICES; except that this
23 subsection (18)(a) does not apply to cremation; OR

24 (b) Arrangement, Supervision or conduct of the funeral ceremony
25 or the final disposition of human remains. ~~or~~

26 (c) ~~Transportation of human remains to or from a funeral~~
27 ~~establishment.~~

1 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-135-104, **amend**
2 (1); and **add** (3) and (4) as follows:

3 **12-135-104. Funeral establishment - subcontractor.**

4 (1) (a) A funeral establishment shall have the appropriate
5 equipment and personnel to adequately AND DIRECTLY provide the funeral
6 services it contracts to provide and shall provide written notice to the
7 consumer specifying any subcontractors or agents routinely handling or
8 caring for human remains.

9 (b) To comply WITH SUBSECTION (1)(a) OF THIS SECTION, the
10 notice must be given when the consumer inquires about the goods or
11 services the funeral establishment provides and must include the names
12 and addresses of the subcontractors, agents, or other providers; except
13 that, if the inquiry is over the telephone, the written notice must be
14 provided when the customer finalizes the arrangements for goods or
15 services with the funeral establishment.

16 (3) A FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT MUST HAVE A PHYSICAL LOCATION
17 THAT:

18 (a) IS SUBJECT TO INSPECTION; AND

19 (b) INCLUDES AT LEAST ONE AREA THAT IS USED TO DIRECTLY
20 PROVIDE FUNERAL SERVICES.

21 (4) A BROKER DOES NOT QUALIFY FOR REGISTRATION AS A
22 FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT.

23 **SECTION 3.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-135-105, **amend**
24 (1)(e), (1)(g)(II), (1)(i) introductory portion, (1)(i)(I), (1)(i)(VIII),
25 (1)(i)(IX), (1)(n), (1)(o), and (1)(p); and **add** (1)(i)(X), (1)(i)(XI), (1)(u),
26 (1)(v), and (1)(w), (1)(x), (1)(y), and (1)(z) as follows:

27 **12-135-105. Unlawful acts.**

1 (1) It is unlawful:

2 (e) For a funeral director, mortuary science practitioner,
3 embalmer, CREMATIONIST, NATURAL REDUCTIONIST, funeral
4 establishment, or facility in which people regularly die or the person's or
5 facility's agent to engage in a business practice that interferes with the
6 freedom of choice of the general public to choose a funeral director,
7 mortuary science practitioner, embalmer, CREMATIONIST, NATURAL
8 REDUCTIONIST, or funeral establishment;

9 (g) To transport or otherwise transfer by common carrier human
10 remains unless:

11 (II) The transport or transfer is to a funeral establishment, funeral
12 director, ~~or~~ embalmer, CREMATIONIST, OR NATURAL REDUCTIONIST within
13 the state of Colorado;

14 (i) For a funeral director, mortuary science practitioner, ~~or~~
15 embalmer, CREMATIONIST, OR NATURAL REDUCTIONIST to admit or permit
16 any person to visit the embalming, cremation, or preparation room during
17 the time a body is being embalmed, cremated, or prepared for final
18 disposition, unless the person:

19 (I) Is a funeral director, mortuary science practitioner,
20 cremationist, NATURAL REDUCTIONIST, or embalmer;

21 (VIII) Is a technician representing a procurement organization as
22 defined in section 15-19-202 for purposes of an anatomical gift; ~~or~~

23 (IX) Is the director or the director's designee;

24 (X) IS PRACTICING UNDER AN ASSOCIATE LICENSE ISSUED
25 PURSUANT TO SECTION 12-135-501; OR

26 (XI) IS PRESENT WITH THE PERMISSION OF A LICENSEE TO ASSIST
27 IN THE NORMAL BUSINESS OPERATIONS OF THE FACILITY, THE LICENSEE IS

1 DIRECTLY RESPONSIBLE FOR THE PERSON'S ACTIVITIES AND ACTIONS, AND
2 THE PERSON AND THE LICENSEE TAKE ALL APPROPRIATE STEPS TO ENSURE
3 THE DIGNITY OF HUMAN REMAINS IS MAINTAINED.

4 (n) To engage in willfully dishonest conduct or commit
5 negligence in the practice of embalming, CREMATING, NATURALLY
6 REDUCING, funeral directing, or providing for final disposition that
7 defrauds or causes injury or is likely to defraud or cause injury;

8 (o) To fail to include in a contract for funeral services the
9 following statement: "~~FUNERAL HOMES AND CREMATORY~~
10 ~~ESTABLISHMENTS ARE REGULATED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF~~
11 ~~REGULATORY AGENCIES. TO FILE A COMPLAINT, CONTACT~~"
12 "FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENTS ARE REGULATED BY THE
13 DEPARTMENT OF REGULATORY AGENCIES. TO FILE A
14 COMPLAINT, CONTACT:", along with the current address, or telephone
15 number, OR EMAIL ADDRESS of the department;

16 (p) For a person owning ~~an indirect or a direct~~ AN interest in a
17 funeral establishment to own ~~an indirect~~ AN interest in a nontransplant
18 tissue bank, as defined in section 12-140-102 (3); ~~or to own a direct~~
19 ~~interest in a nontransplant tissue bank;~~

20 (u) TO COMMIT AN ACT THAT DOES NOT MEET THE GENERALLY
21 ACCEPTED STANDARDS OF MORTUARY SCIENCE OR TO FAIL TO PERFORM AN
22 ACT THAT IS REQUIRED TO MEET THE GENERALLY ACCEPTED STANDARDS
23 OF MORTUARY SCIENCE;

24 (v) TO FAIL TO INCLUDE THE LICENSE NUMBER OF THE DESIGNEE
25 OF THE FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT IN ALL CONTRACTS FOR FUNERAL
26 SERVICES OR FUNERAL GOODS; ■

27 (w) TO FAIL TO PROPERLY SUPERVISE AN ASSOCIATE, LICENSED

1 PURSUANT TO SECTION 12-135-501 (7), WHO IS REQUIRED TO BE
2 PERFORMING TASKS UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF A LICENSED FUNERAL
3 DIRECTOR, MORTUARY SCIENCE PRACTITIONER, CREMATIONIST, NATURAL
4 REDUCTIONIST, OR EMBALMER PURSUANT TO SECTION 12-135-501 (8);

5 (x) TO CREMATE HUMAN REMAINS IN A FACILITY UNLESS THE
6 FACILITY IS REGISTERED PURSUANT TO SECTION 12-135-110;

7 (y) TO REFUSE TO ACCEPT HUMAN REMAINS THAT ARE NOT IN A
8 CASKET OR TO REQUIRE HUMAN REMAINS TO BE PLACED IN A CASKET AT
9 ANY TIME; OR

10 (z) TO ALLOW A CREMATIONIST OR ANY OTHER INDIVIDUAL
11 LICENSED PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE 135 TO PERFORM SERVICES BEYOND
12 THE INDIVIDUAL'S COMPETENCY, TRAINING, OR EDUCATION.

13 **SECTION 4.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-135-107, **amend**
14 (4); and **add** (5) as follows:

15 **12-135-107. Consumer protection.**

16 (4) When quoting funeral prices, either orally, by use of a
17 disclosure statement, or by a final bill, the funeral establishment shall
18 only list those items as cash advances or accommodation items that are
19 paid for or could be paid for by the next of kin in the same amount that
20 is paid by the funeral ~~home~~ ESTABLISHMENT.

21 (5) A CONTRACT FOR FUNERAL SERVICES ENTERED INTO BY A
22 DESIGNEE MUST INCLUDE THE LICENSE NUMBER OF THE FUNERAL
23 DIRECTOR, CREMATIONIST, EMBALMER, MORTUARY SCIENCE
24 PRACTITIONER, OR NATURAL REDUCTIONIST.

25 **SECTION 5.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-135-109, **amend**
26 (2)(b), (4) introductory portion, and (5) as follows:

27 **12-135-109. Exceptions - safe harbor.**

1 (2) (b) If human remains are refrigerated or embalmed under
2 subsection (2)(a) of this section, the body must be interred within, frozen
3 within, or cremated within ~~thirty~~ SIXTY days after death or the process of
4 natural reduction must begin within ~~thirty~~ SIXTY days after death; except
5 that the DIRECTOR OR A coroner WHO DOES NOT HAVE AN INTEREST IN THE
6 BUSINESS OF THE FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT may authorize otherwise in
7 writing. The DIRECTOR OR coroner shall not permit an exception to this
8 subsection (2)(b) unless the applicant SEEKING THE EXCEPTION can
9 demonstrate a legitimate delay caused by unforeseen, uncontrollable
10 circumstances or by a criminal investigation.

11 (4) If a funeral director, mortuary science practitioner, ~~or~~
12 embalmer, CREMATIONIST, NATURAL REDUCTIONIST, OR FUNERAL
13 ESTABLISHMENT has acted in good faith, the funeral director, mortuary
14 science practitioner, ~~or~~ embalmer, CREMATIONIST, NATURAL
15 REDUCTIONIST, OR FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT may rely on a signed
16 statement from a person with the right of final disposition under section
17 15-19-106 that:

18 (5) (a) (I) A funeral establishment, funeral director,
19 CREMATIONIST, NATURAL REDUCTIONIST, EMBALMER, or mortuary science
20 practitioner may dispose of cremated ~~or naturally reduced~~ remains AT THE
21 DISCRETION OF THE FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT, FUNERAL DIRECTOR,
22 CREMATIONIST, NATURAL REDUCTIONIST, EMBALMER, OR MORTUARY
23 SCIENCE PRACTITIONER AND at the expense of the person with the right of
24 final disposition ~~one hundred eighty days after cremation or natural~~
25 ~~reduction if the person was given clear prior notice of this subsection~~
26 ~~(5)(a) and a reasonable opportunity to collect the remains, the exact~~

8 AUTHORIZATION TO CREMATE THE HUMAN REMAINS;

9 (C) THE PERSON WAS GIVEN A REASONABLE OPPORTUNITY TO
10 COLLECT THE CREMAINS;

11 (D) THE FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT, FUNERAL DIRECTOR,
12 CREMATIONIST, NATURAL REDUCTIONIST, EMBALMER, OR MORTUARY
13 SCIENCE PRACTITIONER HAS MADE A REASONABLE AND DOCUMENTED
14 EFFORT TO CONTACT THE PERSON; AND

15 (E) THE EXACT LOCATION OF THE FINAL DISPOSITION AND THE
16 COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE FINAL DISPOSITION ARE RECORDED.

17 (II) ~~A funeral establishment, funeral director, or mortuary science~~
18 ~~practitioner may comply with this subsection (5)(a) by transferring the~~
19 ~~cremated or naturally reduced remains and the records showing the~~
20 ~~funeral establishment and the deceased's name, date of birth, and next of~~
21 ~~kin for final disposition to a facility or place normally used for final~~
22 ~~disposition if the new custodian can comply with this subsection (5)(a)~~
23 RECOVERY OF COSTS PURSUANT TO SUBSECTIONS (5)(a)(I) AND (5)(a)(III)

5 ~~in an ossuary or by scattering the remains in a dedicated cemetery,~~
6 ~~scattering garden, or consecrated ground used exclusively for these~~

17 (B) THE NATURALLY REDUCED REMAINS ARE RETURNED TO THE
18 EARTH IN A RESPECTFUL MANNER;

19 (C) THE PERSON WAS GIVEN A REASONABLE OPPORTUNITY TO
20 COLLECT THE NATURALLY REDUCED REMAINS;

21 (D) THE FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT, FUNERAL DIRECTOR,
22 CREMATIONIST, NATURAL REDUCTIONIST, EMBALMER, OR MORTUARY
23 SCIENCE PRACTITIONER HAS MADE A REASONABLE AND DOCUMENTED
24 EFFORT TO CONTACT THE PERSON; AND

25 (E) THE EXACT LOCATION OF THE FINAL DISPOSITION AND THE
26 COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE FINAL DISPOSITION ARE RECORDED.

27 (IV) The custodian is not liable for the loss or destruction of

1 records required to be kept by PURSUANT TO this subsection (5)(a) if the
2 loss or destruction was not caused by the custodian's negligence OR
3 WILLFUL CONDUCT.

4 (V) ~~If naturally reduced remains are not claimed by the person~~
5 ~~with the right of final disposition within one hundred eighty days after~~
6 ~~natural reduction, a funeral establishment, funeral director, or mortuary~~
7 ~~science practitioner may dispose of the remains in an unrecoverable~~
8 ~~manner by returning the remains to the earth in a respectful manner.~~

9 (b) If the person was cremated prior to July 1, 2003, and the
10 FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT, funeral director, CREMATIONIST, NATURAL
11 REDUCTIONIST, EMBALMER, or mortuary science practitioner reasonably
12 attempts to notify the person with the right of final disposition of the
13 provisions of this subsection (5), the cremated remains may be disposed
14 of in accordance with this subsection (5) notwithstanding a failure to
15 provide the notice of the provisions of this subsection (5) to the person
16 with the right of final disposition prior to disposing of the remains.

17 **SECTION 6.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-135-110, **amend**
18 (1), (2)(a) introductory portion, (2)(a)(III), (2)(a)(IV) introductory
19 portion, (2)(a)(IV)(C), (2)(a)(IV)(E), (2)(b), and (3); and **add** (2)(a)(V)
20 and (3.5) as follows:

21 **12-135-110. Registration required.**

22 (1) Unless practicing at a registered funeral establishment OR
23 AFFILIATE LOCATION pursuant to this section, a person shall not practice
24 as, or offer the services of, a mortuary science practitioner, funeral
25 director, ~~or~~ embalmer, CREMATIONIST, OR NATURAL REDUCTIONIST, nor
26 shall the funeral establishment OR AFFILIATE LOCATION sell or offer to sell
27 funeral goods and services to the public.

1 (2) (a) Each funeral establishment shall register with the director
2 using forms as determined by the director. The registration ~~shall~~ MUST
3 include the following:

4 (III) The date the funeral establishment began doing business; ~~and~~

5 (IV) ~~A list of each of the following services provided at each~~
6 ~~funeral establishment location~~ WHETHER THE FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT
7 PROVIDES THE FOLLOWING SERVICES:

8 (C) ~~Transporting human remains to or from the funeral~~
9 ~~establishment or the place of final disposition~~ CREMATING HUMAN

11 (E) Selling preneed contracts; AND

12 (V) THE SPECIFIC LOCATION AND A LIST OF SERVICES OFFERED AT
13 EACH AFFILIATE LOCATION UNDER COMMON OWNERSHIP WITH THE
14 FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT.

15 (b) Each funeral establishment registration shall be renewed,
16 according to a schedule established by the director in accordance with
17 section 12-20-202 (1), in a form as determined by the director. At the time
18 of renewal, each funeral establishment shall attest to whether the funeral
19 establishment sells preneed contracts. ~~The director shall enter into a~~
20 ~~memorandum of understanding with the commissioner of insurance to~~
21 ~~share information regarding funeral establishments that sell preneed~~
22 ~~contracts.~~

23 (3) Each funeral establishment shall appoint an individual as the
24 designee of the funeral establishment. A designee must:

25 (a) Be at least eighteen years ~~of age~~ OLD;

13 (3.5) A DESIGNEE APPOINTED FOR A REGISTERED FUNERAL

15 AFFILIATE LOCATION FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT THAT IS UNDER COMMON
16 OWNERSHIP WITH THE REGISTERED FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT.

17 **SECTION 7.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-135-112, **amend**
18 (2)(b), (3), and (4) as follows:

19 **12-135-112. Standards of practice - embalming - transporting.**

20 (2) A funeral establishment that transports human remains shall:

21 (b) Transport human remains in a ~~safe and sanitary~~ manner THAT:

22 (I) IS CUSTOMARY WITHIN THE PROFESSION;

23 (II) IS SAFE, SANITARY, AND DIGNIFIED; AND

24 (III) DOES NOT INVOLVE STACKING HUMAN REMAINS.

25 (3) A funeral establishment shall remove any implanted device in
26 human remains before transporting the body to a crematory OR
27 COMMENCING CREMATION.

1 (4) (a) A funeral establishment shall maintain a sanitary
2 preparation room with:

3 (I) Sanitary flooring;

4 (II) Drainage;

5 (III) Ventilation; ~~and~~

6 (IV) ACCESS TO refrigeration SUFFICIENT TO ACCOMMODATE THE
7 NEEDS OF THE FUNERAL ESTABLISHMENT; and
