101 **CONCERNING SUPPORT FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS IN THE**
102 **STATE.**

1 WHEREAS, Law enforcement officers in Colorado serve with
2 dedication and bravery, risking their lives daily to protect communities,
3 uphold the rule of law, and ensure public safety; and

4 WHEREAS, These officers respond to emergencies, prevent
5 crime, and foster positive relationships with the residents they serve,
6 contributing immensely to the well-being and security of all Coloradans;
7 and

8 WHEREAS, Colorado's law enforcement officers have made
9 significant strides in enhancing transparency and accountability through
10 the widespread adoption of body-worn cameras and real-time crime
11 centers while strengthening community trust and partnerships through
12 expanded outreach and collaborative initiatives with the residents they
13 serve; and

14 WHEREAS, Officers continue to perform their duties with
15 courage and commitment amid new challenges in 2026, including staffing

3 WHEREAS, It is fitting that the Colorado General Assembly
4 publicly recognize and honor the men and women of law enforcement for
5 their sacrifices and vital contributions; now, therefore,

6 *Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Seventy-fifth*
7 *General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

8 (1) That the House of Representatives hereby honors and
9 expresses its deepest gratitude and appreciation for the men and women
10 of Colorado's law enforcement agencies for the vital role they play in
11 safeguarding our communities and for building public trust; and

12 (2) That the House of Representatives encourages all Coloradans
13 to engage with law enforcement to build trust in our communities and
14 support law enforcement officers in recognition of their ongoing service,
15 dedication, and commitment to our communities.

16 *Be It Further Resolved,* That copies of this Resolution be sent to
17 the Governor of Colorado, the Colorado Fraternal Order of Police, the
18 Colorado Association of Chiefs of Police, the County Sheriffs of
19 Colorado, the Colorado Municipal League, the Chair of the Board of
20 County Commissioners for each of Colorado's 62 counties, the President
21 of the City Council of the City and County of Denver, and the Mayor of
22 the City and County of Broomfield.
