Fiscal note status: This revised fiscal note reflects the reengrossed bill. The bill was initially recommended by the Treatment of Persons with Behavioral Health Disorders in the Criminal and Juvenile Justice Systems Committee.

Summary Information

Overview. The bill requires the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing and the Behavioral Health Administration to publish lists of secure transportation providers.

Types of impacts. The bill is projected to affect the following areas on an ongoing basis:

Summary of Legislation

The bill requires the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing (HCPF) to publish a list of secure transportation providers that contract with a managed care entity. The Behavioral Health Administration (BHA) is required to publish a list of secure transportation providers that contract with a Behavioral Health Administrative Services Organization. The lists must include contact information for the providers, including an active phone number or website.

State Expenditures

The bill minimally increases workload for HCPF and the BHA to comply with the reporting requirements. This work can be absorbed within current resources.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
