Fiscal note status: The final fiscal note reflects the introduced bill. This bill was postponed indefinitely by the Senate Health and Human Services Committee on April 23, 2026; therefore, the impacts identified in this analysis do not take effect.

Summary Information

Overview. The bill would have added a contract provision between health insurance carriers and health care providers regarding a material change to a contract.

No fiscal impact. The bill had no fiscal impact on state or local governments.

Appropriations. No appropriation is required.

Summary of Legislation

For contracts between health insurance carriers and health care providers, the bill requires a carrier to provide notice of a material change to a contract by registered mail and email to the provider or administrator who signed the contract. The written notice must clearly set forth the proposed material change.

Assessment of No Fiscal Impact

The bill updates contract terms between health insurance carriers and healthcare providers. This results in no change to state or local government revenue or expenditures. For this reason, the bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect January 1, 2027, assuming no referendum petition is filed, and applies to contracts entered into or renewed on or after this date
