101 **CONCERNING RECOGNITION OF MILITARY, VETERANS, AND MIA/POW**  
102 **APPRECIATION DAY.**

1           WHEREAS, Colorado has a proud and distinguished history of  
2 dedicated military service by men and women of this state whose courage,  
3 heroism, and sacrifice preserve the liberties and democratic way of life set  
4 forth in our state and federal constitutions; and

5           WHEREAS, Colorado is home to a significant number of military  
6 installations, including Fort Carson, the United States Air Force  
7 Academy, Buckley Air Force Base, Peterson Air Force Base, Schriever  
8 Air Force Base, and Cheyenne Mountain Air Force Station, that  
9 contribute not only to the national security of our nation but to the  
10 economic health of our state; and

1           WHEREAS, Colorado benefits significantly from the presence and  
2 military service of the more than 49,000 men and women in our state who  
3 serve in the United States Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, and  
4 Coast Guard; the branch Reserves; the Colorado National Guard; and the  
5 Civil Air Patrol; and

6           WHEREAS, The men and women of the Colorado National Guard  
7 have served in defense of our nation and as the first military responders  
8 in support of civil authorities during domestic emergencies and are  
9 celebrating their 159th anniversary this year; and

10           WHEREAS, In times of conflict around the globe, it is particularly  
11 appropriate to recognize the Coloradans in all branches and components  
12 of the Armed Services who serve around the world to protect the security  
13 and peace of our nation and other nations; and

14           WHEREAS, In addition to active members of the Armed Services,  
15 Colorado is the proud home of more than 403,000 military veterans who  
16 have served their country long and well and who bring great honor and  
17 distinction to the state; and

18           WHEREAS, Colorado is home not only to active duty service  
19 personnel and veterans but also to the countless family members of these  
20 men and women who display the same dedication, courage, and sacrifice;  
21 and

22           WHEREAS, We should also never forget the sacrifices made for  
23 us by the 94 service members from Colorado declared missing in action  
24 or prisoners of war while defending the principles of liberty and justice  
25 in conflicts in Korea, Laos, and Vietnam; and

26           WHEREAS, Disparate and diverse groups of Coloradans, such as  
27 persons who are African-American, Latino or Latina, or Hispanic, in  
28 addition to men and women of all backgrounds, are bound together in the  
29 United States Armed Services by their selfless dedication to the spirit of  
30 our nation, the ideals of freedom and democracy, and the cause of  
31 democracy and stability around the globe; now, therefore,

32           *Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the*  
33 *Seventy-second General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate*  
34 *concurring herein:*

1 (1) That we, the members of the Seventy-second General  
2 Assembly, hereby extend our heartfelt gratitude to our state's veterans,  
3 past and present, to all military men and women currently serving in the  
4 Armed Services, and to the family members of active duty personnel and  
5 veterans and that we remember and honor those prisoners of war and  
6 those missing in action from previous conflicts;

7 (2) That we express our continued partnership with and support  
8 of Fort Carson and maintain our strong commitment to supporting  
9 ongoing military training at the Mountain Post; and

10 (3) That we encourage the citizens of Colorado to join in the  
11 celebration of Colorado's Military, Veterans, and MIA/POW  
12 Appreciation Day on February 1, 2019, in recognition and honor of the  
13 thousands of fellow citizens in the military who protect and serve their  
14 communities, state, and country.

27 Base; Colonel Christopher L. Grice, Commander, Pueblo Chemical  
28 Depot; the Colorado Board of Veterans Affairs; the United Veterans  
29 Committee of Colorado; the Mountain States Chapter, Paralyzed Veterans  
30 of America; the American Legion Department of Colorado; the  
31 Department of Colorado Veterans of Foreign Wars; the Broomfield  
32 Veterans Memorial Museum; the Wings Over the Rockies Air and Space  
33 Museum; and each member of Colorado's Congressional delegation.
