Description of Amendments in This Packet

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating \$47,000 cash funds from the Marijuana Tax Cash Fund to the Department of Education for FY 2017-18.

Points to Consider*Revenue Source/ Related Budget Information*

A total of \$117.7 million is projected to be available in the Marijuana Tax Cash Fund for appropriation in FY 2017-18. As detailed on the following page, based on the proposed budget package for FY 2017-18 and the first report of the first conference committee on the Long Bill (S.B. 17-254), \$2.6 million remains available for other 2017 legislation.
