Summary of Legislation

Under current law, the Department of Revenue (DOR) provides a beneficiary designation form that allows the owner or joint owners of a vehicle to arrange for the transfer of the vehicle's title to a named beneficiary upon the owner's or owners' death. The bill assigns the responsibility of providing beneficiary designation forms to the Division of Motor Vehicles within the Department of Revenue (DOR), rather than DOR itself.

The bill clarifies that a personal representative of the estate of a deceased vehicle owner, a successor, or a person acting on behalf of the successor, are not liable for obtaining a new vehicle title or for transferring the vehicle title if they have no knowledge of a valid beneficiary designation form.

State Expenditures

The bill will create a minimal workload increase for DOR in FY 2017-18 to train staff, and to update rules, forms, and manuals. These workload increases can be accomplished within existing appropriations. The administrative changes required with this legislation will not impact the process for the transfer to a title to a beneficiary.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on May 3, 2017, and takes effect August 9, 2017, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
