Committee on Appropriations.

After consideration on the merits, the Committee recommends the following:

SB21-166 be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation and with a recommendation that it be placed on the consent calendar:

1 Amend printed bill, page 3, strike lines 7 through 15 and substitute:

2        "(a) "EMERGENCY RESPONDER" MEANS A COUNTY IMPROVEMENT  
3 DISTRICT PROVIDING FIRE PROTECTION SERVICES OR ANY OTHER COUNTY  
4 DEPARTMENT OR AGENCY THAT PROVIDES FIRE OR EMERGENCY MEDICAL  
5 SERVICES, MUNICIPAL FIRE DEPARTMENTS, FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICTS,  
6 METROPOLITAN DISTRICTS PROVIDING FIRE PROTECTION SERVICES, FIRE  
7 AUTHORITIES, HAZARDOUS MATERIALS AUTHORITIES, VOLUNTEER FIRE  
8 DEPARTMENTS RECOGNIZED UNDER THE "VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT  
9 ORGANIZATION ACT", SECTION 24-33.5-1208.5, AND ANY AMBULANCE  
10 SERVICE OPERATED BY A SUBDIVISION OF STATE GOVERNMENT.".

11 Page 14, after line 27 insert:

12        **"SECTION 6. Appropriation.** (1) For the 2021-22 state fiscal  
13 year, \$1,033,500 is appropriated to the department of public safety. This  
14 appropriation is from the general fund. To implement this act, the  
15 department may use this appropriation as follows:

16            (a) \$56,555 for use by the executive director's office for vehicle  
17 lease payments;

18            (b) \$42,240 for use by the executive director's office for leased  
19 space; and

20            (c) \$934,705 for use by the division of fire prevention and control

1 for wildland fire management services, which amount is based on an  
2 assumption that the department will require an additional 6.4 FTE.".

3 Renumber succeeding section accordingly.

4 Page 1, line 102 strike "**COMMISSION.**" and substitute "**COMMISSION,**  
5 **AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.**".
