

AMPLIFY Act: Operator Exit and Resident Election Rights

Legislating Drafter Working Package — 33-bill modular AMPLIFY build

Legislating drafter file. This chapter draft is designed to stand on its own and to support modular insertion into broader AMPLIFY stacks.

Bill 17. AMPLIFY Act: Operator Exit and Resident Election Rights

Single subject. Resident protections and elections when a covered operator exits, fails, transfers assets, or becomes insolvent.

Purpose. Prevent resident interests from being stranded on shutdown or sale.

Draft structure

Section	Core draft direction
1. Short title	This act shall be known and may be cited as the “AMPLIFY Act: Operator Exit and Resident Election Rights”.
2. Legislative declaration	The general assembly finds and declares that prevent resident interests from being stranded on shutdown or sale.
3. Definitions	Definitions should be alphabetized, lowercase, and drafted in singular form unless a term of art requires otherwise.
4. Operative sections	Substantive rights, duties, approvals, or restrictions listed below.
5. Administration	Rulemaking, designation of administering authority, records, notices, and implementation mechanics.
6. Construction	Independent operation, severability, no implied repeal, and other necessary construction clauses.
7. Effective date	Effective date and any conditional clause required by filing strategy.

Draft definitions

operator exit event. shutdown, bankruptcy, receivership, insolvency, sale, migration, or other material transition affecting covered resident interests.

resident election. a resident's authorized choice among options provided by law regarding handling of the resident's covered data or interests.

Draft operative provisions

Section 4. Exit notice

- A covered operator experiencing an operator exit event shall provide notice in the manner required by law or rule.
- Notice must identify the resident options, relevant dates, and any transfer or deletion consequences known at the time.

Section 5. Resident elections

- A resident may exercise any resident election authorized by law concerning retention, deletion, transfer, verification, or successor handling of protected digital interests.
- A covered operator shall not misstate, suppress, or materially obstruct a resident election.

Section 6. Protective construction

- This act shall be construed to preserve resident control and minimize forced transfer of protected identity-linked interests during an operator exit event.

Required construction clauses

- Independent operation. This act operates independently and remains effective whether or not any related measure or companion act is adopted.
- Severability. If any provision of this act or its application is held invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or applications that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application.
- Single-subject construction. This act shall be construed to embrace only the single subject described in its title and no separate subject shall be inferred from a remedy, definition, recordkeeping duty, funding mechanism, or construction clause that is necessarily and properly connected to that subject.
