Bill 12. AMPLIFY Act: Meaningful Human Review and Due Process

Single subject. Standards for meaningful human review and minimum administrative due process in consequential digital decisions.

Purpose. Narrowly isolate the review and due-process layer.

Draft structure

Section	Core draft direction
1. Short title	This act shall be known and may be cited as the “AMPLIFY Act: Meaningful Human Review and Due Process”.
2. Legislative declaration	The general assembly finds and declares that narrowly isolate the review and due-process layer.
3. Definitions	Definitions should be alphabetized, lowercase, and drafted in singular form unless a term of art requires otherwise.
4. Operative sections	Substantive rights, duties, approvals, or restrictions listed below.
5. Administration	Rulemaking, designation of administering authority, records, notices, and implementation mechanics.
6. Construction	Independent operation, severability, no implied repeal, and other necessary construction clauses.
7. Effective date	Effective date and any conditional clause required by filing strategy.

Draft definitions

meaningful human review. review by a human decision-maker with genuine authority, access to relevant information, and freedom to depart from an automated recommendation.

consequential digital decision. a covered decision materially affecting housing, work, education, benefits, credit, insurance, legal access, or similar interests.

due process notice. a notice sufficient to explain the action, basis, and available review path.

Draft operative provisions

Section 4. Human review standard

- A person is not receiving meaningful human review if the human reviewer lacks authority, lacks relevant information, or merely rubber-stamps an automated output.
- A covered operator shall not represent a process as meaningfully human-reviewed unless the standard in this act is met.

Section 5. Minimum due process

- Where law or rule requires review of a consequential digital decision, the affected person must receive due process notice and an available review path within the time prescribed by law or rule.

Required construction clauses

- Independent operation. This act operates independently and remains effective whether or not any related measure or companion act is adopted.
- Severability. If any provision of this act or its application is held invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or applications that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application.
- Single-subject construction. This act shall be construed to embrace only the single subject described in its title and no separate subject shall be inferred from a remedy, definition, recordkeeping duty, funding mechanism, or construction clause that is necessarily and properly connected to that subject.
