

AMPLIFY Act: Minor Digital Registry Protections

Legislating Drafter Working Package — 33-bill modular AMPLIFY build

Legislating drafter file. This chapter draft is designed to stand on its own and to support modular insertion into broader AMPLIFY stacks.

Bill 6. AMPLIFY Act: Minor Digital Registry Protections

Single subject. Special registry protections, access controls, and guardrails for minor digital records.

Purpose. Separate minor registry rules from the general registry so they can stand alone if needed.

Draft structure

Section	Core draft direction
1. Short title	This act shall be known and may be cited as the “AMPLIFY Act: Minor Digital Registry Protections”.
2. Legislative declaration	The general assembly finds and declares that separate minor registry rules from the general registry so they can stand alone if needed.
3. Definitions	Definitions should be alphabetized, lowercase, and drafted in singular form unless a term of art requires otherwise.
4. Operative sections	Substantive rights, duties, approvals, or restrictions listed below.
5. Administration	Rulemaking, designation of administering authority, records, notices, and implementation mechanics.
6. Construction	Independent operation, severability, no implied repeal, and other necessary construction clauses.
7. Effective date	Effective date and any conditional clause required by filing strategy.

Draft definitions

minor record. a registry entry primarily concerning the protected digital interests of a minor.

guardian access. access by a parent, legal guardian, fiduciary, or other person authorized by law.

sensitive minor field. a registry field identified by rule as requiring heightened protection.

Draft operative provisions

Section 4. Restricted access

- Minor records shall default to the most protective access tier authorized by law.
- Sensitive minor fields may be viewed, amended, or exported only by persons and systems authorized by rule.

Section 5. Audit requirements

- Every access to a sensitive minor field shall be logged with user identity, time, purpose, and export status.
- The administering authority shall provide periodic integrity reviews for minor-access controls.

Section 6. Protective construction

- This act shall be construed in favor of minimizing unnecessary exposure of minor identity-linked information.

Required construction clauses

- Independent operation. This act operates independently and remains effective whether or not any related measure or companion act is adopted.
- Severability. If any provision of this act or its application is held invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or applications that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application.
- Single-subject construction. This act shall be construed to embrace only the single subject described in its title and no separate subject shall be inferred from a remedy, definition, recordkeeping duty, funding mechanism, or construction clause that is necessarily and properly connected to that subject.
