Bill 5. AMPLIFY Act: Digital Registry and Recording System

Single subject. Creation of a resident digital rights registry and recording framework.

Purpose. Provide a recording and notice architecture for protected digital interests.

Draft structure

Section	Core draft direction
1. Short title	This act shall be known and may be cited as the “AMPLIFY Act: Digital Registry and Recording System”.
2. Legislative declaration	The general assembly finds and declares that provide a recording and notice architecture for protected digital interests.
3. Definitions	Definitions should be alphabetized, lowercase, and drafted in singular form unless a term of art requires otherwise.
4. Operative sections	Substantive rights, duties, approvals, or restrictions listed below.
5. Administration	Rulemaking, designation of administering authority, records, notices, and implementation mechanics.
6. Construction	Independent operation, severability, no implied repeal, and other necessary construction clauses.
7. Effective date	Effective date and any conditional clause required by filing strategy.

Draft definitions

registry. the official recording system created by this act.

recorded notice. a filing, designation, restriction, or correction recognized by the registry.

minor subregistry. a protected registry layer for minor records with heightened access controls.

Draft operative provisions

Section 4. Registry creation

- An administering authority shall create and maintain a registry capable of recording resident designations, notices, successor data designations, and other filings authorized by law.
- The registry must support correction, amendment, and revocation workflows established by rule.

Section 5. Access classes

- The registry shall distinguish between public, protected, confidential, and restricted fields by rule.
- Minor subregistry records must receive heightened access controls and auditing.

Section 6. Legal effect

- A recorded notice has the legal effect assigned by the act authorizing its filing and shall at minimum provide traceable notice to the registry system and authorized reviewing bodies.

Section 7. Audit and integrity

- The registry shall maintain access logs, correction histories, and integrity controls sufficient to detect tampering or unauthorized access.

Required construction clauses

- Independent operation. This act operates independently and remains effective whether or not any related measure or companion act is adopted.
- Severability. If any provision of this act or its application is held invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or applications that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application.
- Single-subject construction. This act shall be construed to embrace only the single subject described in its title and no separate subject shall be inferred from a remedy, definition, recordkeeping duty, funding mechanism, or construction clause that is necessarily and properly connected to that subject.
