

AMPLIFY Act: Tribal Digital Sovereignty

Legislating drafter file. This chapter draft is designed to stand on its own and to support modular insertion into broader AMPLIFY stacks.

Bill 29. AMPLIFY Act: Tribal Digital Sovereignty

Single subject. Government-to-government support for tribal digital infrastructure, rights capacity, and interoperability.

Purpose. Create a respectful sovereign partnership chapter.

Draft structure

Section	Core draft direction
1. Short title	This act shall be known and may be cited as the “AMPLIFY Act: Tribal Digital Sovereignty”.
2. Legislative declaration	The general assembly finds and declares that create a respectful sovereign partnership chapter.
3. Definitions	Definitions should be alphabetized, lowercase, and drafted in singular unless a term of art requires otherwise.
4. Operative sections	Substantive rights, duties, approvals, or restrictions listed below.
5. Administration	Rulemaking, designation of administering authority, records, notices, and implementation mechanics.
6. Construction	Independent operation, severability, no implied repeal, and other necessary construction clauses.
7. Effective date	Effective date and any conditional clause required by filing strategy.

Draft definitions

tribal partner. a federally recognized tribe or other tribal government recognized by law for purposes of authorized partnership.

government-to-government agreement. an agreement entered into consistent with law respecting sovereign status and jurisdiction.

Draft operative provisions

Section 4. Partnership authority

- A designated state entity may enter into government-to-government agreements supporting tribal digital infrastructure, rights capacity, data governance, or interoperability, consistent with law.
- No provision of this act shall be construed to diminish tribal sovereignty.

Section 5. Support uses

- Authorized support may include infrastructure assistance, interoperability planning, rights-protection coordination, or other uses approved by agreement and law.

Required construction clauses

- Independent operation. This act operates independently and remains effective whether or not any related measure or companion act is adopted.
- Severability. If any provision of this act or its application is held invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or applications that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application.
- Single-subject construction. This act shall be construed to embrace only the single subject described in its title and no separate subject shall be inferred from a remedy, definition, recordkeeping duty, funding mechanism, or construction clause that is necessarily and properly connected to that subject.
