Summary Information

Overview. The measure removes the requirement in the Colorado Constitution that members of the General Assembly and civil officers take an oath or affirmation to support the Constitution of the United States.

No Fiscal Impact. The measure has no fiscal impact on state or local government.

Summary of Measure

The measure amends the Colorado Constitution to remove the requirement that members of the General Assembly and civil officers take an oath or affirmation to support the Constitution of the United States. This also applies when members of the General Assembly are called to a constitutional convention.

Assessment of No Fiscal Impact

The measure does not change the revenue or expenditures of any state or local government and is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Effective Date

If approved by voters at the 2026 general election, this measure takes effect on January 14, 2027.
