

The basic pattern and new terminology for transfers in LLS 18-0067
for the Administrative Organization Act & Colorado Revised Statutes

In the Administrative Organization Act in Article 1 of Title 24:

(the principle is to make the transfer only in the Administrative Organization Act and to state that the entity exercises its powers, duties, and functions as a **type 1** or **type 2** entity):

if type 1:

The [entity] is transferred by a **type 1** transfer to the [department name]. The [entity] exercises its powers, duties, and functions as a **type 1** entity, as defined in section 24-1-105.

if type 2:

The [entity] is transferred by a **type 2** transfer to the [department name]. The [entity] exercises its powers, duties, and functions under the department as a **type 2** entity, as defined in section 24-1-105.

plural versions:

The [entity] and the [office of the director] are transferred by a **type 1** transfer to the [department name]. The [entity] and [the office] exercise their powers, duties, and functions as **type 1** entities, as defined in section 24-1-105.

The [entity] and the [office of the director] are transferred by a **type 2** transfer to the [department name]. The [entity] and [the office] exercise their powers, duties, and functions under the department as **type 2** entities, as defined in section 24-1-105.

In the Organic Statute:

(the principle here is to specify in the organic statute the **type 1** or **type 2** status of the entity as based upon the designation set forth in the Administrative Organization Act; old language regarding transfers is eliminated.)

if type 1:

The [entity] is created in the [department name]. The [entity] exercises its powers, duties, and functions as a **type 1** entity, as defined in section 24-1-105.

if type 2:

The [entity] is created in the [department name]. The [entity] exercises its powers, duties and functions under the department as a **type 2** entity, as defined in section 24-1-105.
