BY REPRESENTATIVE(S) Bird, Sirota, Taggart, Jodeh, Marshall, Ricks, Snyder, Young, McCluskie; also SENATOR(S) Zenzinger, Bridges, Kirkmeyer, Priola.

CONCERNING A SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION TO THE OFFICES OF THE GOVERNOR, LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR, AND STATE PLANNING AND BUDGETING.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. Appropriation to the offices of the governor, lieutenant governor, and state planning and budgeting for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023. In Session Laws of Colorado 2023, section 2 of chapter 474, (SB 23-214), amend Part V as follows:
