CONCERNING A SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH CARE POLICY AND FINANCING.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. Appropriation to the department of health care policy and financing for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023. In Session Laws of Colorado 2023, section 2 of chapter 474, (SB 23-214), amend Part VI as follows:

# SECTION 2. Appropriation to the department of health care policy and financing for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022.

- (1) For the 2022-23 state fiscal year, \$24,956,492 is appropriated to the department of health care policy and financing and is for the payment of overexpenditures of line item appropriations contained in Part VI of section 2 of chapter 507 (HB 22-1329), Session Laws of Colorado 2022, as follows:
- (a) \$20,329,789 from the general fund for medical and long-term care services for Medicaid eligible individuals;
- (b) \$474,709 from the healthcare affordability and sustainability fee cash fund created in Section 25.5-4-402.4 (5)(a), C.R.S., for behavioral health capitation payments;
- (c) \$2,927,608 from the general fund, for adult comprehensive services; and
- (d) \$1,224,386 from the healthcare affordability and sustainability fee cash fund created in Section 25.5-4-402.4 (5)(a), C.R.S., for adult supported living services.
- (2) In accordance with section 24-75-109 (4)(a), C.R.S., all restrictions on funds for the department of health care policy and financing for the 2023-24 state fiscal year for the amounts and items of appropriation listed in this section are released.
- SECTION 3. Appropriation to the department of health care policy and financing for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023. In Session Laws of Colorado 2023, amend section 5 (3) of chapter 277, (HB 23-1215), as follows:
- Section 5. Appropriation adjustments to 2023 long bill. (3) For the 2023-24 state fiscal year, \$516,950 is appropriated to the department of health care policy and financing for use by the executive director's office. This appropriation is from the general fund. To implement this act, the office may use this appropriation for general professional services and special projects. Of the Money appropriated in this subsection not expended prior to July 1, 2024, up to \$433,700 is further appropriated to the department for the 2024-25 state fiscal year for the same purpose.

**SECTION 4. Safety clause.** The general assembly finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state institutions.
