BY SENATOR(S) Bridges, Amabile, Kirkmeyer; also REPRESENTATIVE(S) Bird, Sirota, Taggart, Duran, Joseph, Story, Titone, McCluskie.

CONCERNING FUNDING FOR CAPITAL CONSTRUCTION INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY, AND MAKING SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. Capital construction information technology appropriations for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024. In Session Laws of Colorado 2024, amend section 4 of chapter 519, (HB 24- 1430), as follows:

Section 4. Capital Construction Information Technology Appropriation.
